INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to give you information regarding the resolutions to repurchase Shares, to allot and issue new Shares, the re-election of Directors, the appointment of new independent non-executive Director, the Proposed Amendments and the adoption of the Amended Articles, and to seek your approval of the resolutions in relation thereto to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting.

Under the Listing Rules, the Company is required to provide you with information reasonably necessary to enable you to make an informed decision as to whether to vote for or against the resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting. This circular is prepared for such purpose.

EXPLANATORY STATEMENT ON REPURCHASE MANDATE

The explanatory statement as required under the Listing Rules to provide the requisite information to you for consideration of the proposed grant of the Repurchase Mandate is set out below:

LISTING RULES RELATING TO THE REPURCHASE OF SHARES

The Listing Rules permit companies whose primary listing is on the Stock Exchange to repurchase their shares on the Stock Exchange subject to certain restrictions, the most important of which are summarised below. The Company is empowered by its memorandum of association and Articles, the Companies Ordinance and the Companies Act to repurchase its own Shares.

(a) Shareholders' approval

The Listing Rules provide that all on-market share repurchases by a company with its primary listing on the Stock Exchange must be approved in advance by an ordinary resolution, either by way of a general mandate or by specific approval with reference to a specific transaction.

(b) Source of funds

Repurchases must be funded out of funds which are legally available for the purpose in accordance with the Company's memorandum of association, the Articles, the Companies Ordinance and the Companies Act. Any repurchases by the Company may only be made out of the profits of the Company or out of the proceeds of a fresh issue of shares made for the purpose of the repurchase or, if authorised by the Articles and subject to the Companies Act, out of capital and, in the case of any premium payable on the repurchase, out of the profits of the Company or out of the share premium account of the Company, if authorised by the Articles and subject to the Companies Act, out of capital.

(c) Maximum number of Shares to be repurchased and subsequent issues

A maximum of 10% of the Shares in issue at the date of passing the relevant resolution at the Annual General Meeting may be repurchased by the Company on the Stock Exchange.

GENERAL MANDATES TO BE GRANTED TO DIRECTORS TO MAKE ON-MARKET REPURCHASES OF SHARES AND TO ALLOT AND ISSUE NEW SHARES

At the 2022 annual general meeting of the Company held on 13 May 2022, the Directors were granted a general mandate to allot, issue and deal with Shares in the capital of the Company and a general mandate to repurchase Shares on the Stock Exchange. These mandates will expire at the conclusion of the forthcoming Annual General Meeting. To facilitate future allotment and issue of Shares by the Directors on behalf of the Company, the Directors will seek the approval of the Shareholders for the grant of the general mandate and the Repurchase Mandate as provided under resolutions no. 4(A) to 4(C) in the notice of the Annual General Meeting.

Ordinary resolution no. 4(A) contained in the notice of the Annual General Meeting relates to the granting of a general mandate to the Directors to allot and issue new Shares up to a maximum of 20% of the number of Shares in issue at the date of passing of the resolution. The authority conferred on the Directors by this mandate will continue in force until the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company, or any earlier date as referred to in paragraph (d) of the ordinary resolution no. 4(A). In addition, subject to the approval by the Shareholders of the ordinary resolution no. 4(C) contained in the notice of the Annual General Meeting, the number of Shares repurchased by the Company under the Repurchase Mandate will also be added to the 20% general mandate as mentioned above. The Directors have no immediate plan to allot and issue any new Shares other than such Shares which may fall to be issued upon the grant of awarded shares under share award scheme and the exercise of any options granted under the Share Option Scheme.

Ordinary resolution no. 4(B) contained in the notice of the Annual General Meeting relates to the granting of the Repurchase Mandate to the Directors to repurchase, on the Stock Exchange, Shares of up to a maximum of 10% of the number of Shares in issue as at the date of the passing of the resolution. The authority conferred on the Directors by this mandate will continue in force until the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company, or any earlier date as referred to in paragraph (c) of ordinary resolution no. 4(B).

Ordinary resolution no. 4(C) contained in the notice of the Annual General Meeting relates to the extension of the general mandate to be granted to the Directors to allot and issue new Shares during the relevant period by adding to it the number of Shares (if any) repurchased under the Repurchase Mandate. The authority conferred on the Directors by this mandate will continue in force until the conclusion of the next annual general meeting of the Company, or any earlier date as referred to in paragraph (d) of ordinary resolution no. 4(A).

REASONS FOR SHARE REPURCHASES

Although the Directors have no present intention of repurchasing any Shares, they believe that the flexibility afforded by the Repurchase Mandate would be in the best interests of the Company and its Shareholders. At any time in the future when Shares are trading at a discount to their underlying value, the ability of the Company to repurchase

Shares will be beneficial to those Shareholders who retain their investment in the Company since their attributable percentage interest in the Shares of the Company would increase in proportion to the number of Shares repurchased by the Company. The Shares repurchased by the Company under the Repurchase Mandate shall be cancelled automatically. The Directors will only make such repurchases in circumstances where they consider to be beneficial to the Company and its Shareholders.

SHARE CAPITAL

As at the Latest Practicable Date, the issued share capital of the Company comprised 9,719,257,645 Shares.

Subject to the passing of ordinary resolution no. 4(B), the Company would be allowed under the Repurchase Mandate to repurchase a maximum of 971,925,764 Shares, i.e. 10% of the total issued Shares as at the date of passing of the resolution, on the basis that no Shares would be issued or repurchased prior to the date of the Annual General Meeting.

Subject to the passing of ordinary resolution no. 4(A), the Company would be allowed under the mandate to issue a maximum of 1,943,851,529 Shares, i.e. 20% of the total issued Shares as at the date of passing of the resolution, on the basis that no Shares would be issued or repurchased prior to the date of the Annual General Meeting.

FUNDING OF REPURCHASES

The Directors propose that repurchases of Shares under the Repurchase Mandate in these circumstances would be financed from the Company's internal resources or working capital facilities.

In repurchasing Shares, the Company may only apply funds legally available for such purpose in accordance with the memorandum of association of the Company, the Articles and the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands.

Taking into account the current working capital position of the Company, there may be a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is to be carried out in full at any time during the proposed repurchase period. However, the Directors do not propose to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such extent that would have a material adverse impact on the working capital requirements of the Company or the gearing levels which in the opinion of the Directors are from time to time appropriate for the Company.

- 1. The entire issued share capital of Landmark Worldwide Holdings Limited is held and beneficially owned as to 25% by each of Messrs Wang Ya Nan, Wang Ya Hua, Wong Ah Yeung and Wong Ah Yu.
- 2. The entire issued share capital of E-Growth Resources Limited is held and beneficially owned as to 100% by Mr. Wang Ya Nan.

On the basis of the current shareholding held by the Parties, if the Repurchase Mandate is exercised in full (and assuming that the issued share capital of the Company remains unchanged up to the date of the forthcoming Annual General Meeting), such increase in percentage of its shareholdings will give rise to an obligation for the Parties to make a mandatory offer under Rule 26 of the Takeovers Code. The Directors have no intention to exercise the Repurchase Mandate to such an extent that the Parties would become obligated to make a mandatory offer under the Takeovers Code.

Save as disclose above, the Directors are currently not aware of any consequences which will arise under the Takeovers Code as a result of any repurchase made under the Repurchase Mandate.

The Directors do not propose or intend to repurchase Shares which could result in mandatory offer under the Takeovers Code and less than the prescribed minimum percentage of Shares held in public hands (i.e. 25%). The Stock Exchange has stated that if less than 25% of the total number of Shares in issue are held in the public hands, or if the Stock Exchange believes that a false market exists or may exist in the trading of the Shares or that there are insufficient Shares held in the public hands to maintain an orderly market, it will consider exercising its discretion to suspend the dealing in the Shares.

None of the Directors, to the best of their knowledge having made all reasonable enquiries, or any of their respective close associates, presently intends to sell Shares to the Company in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

The Company has not been notified by any connected persons of the Company that they have a present intention to sell any Shares, nor they have undertaken not to sell any Shares held by them to the Company in the event that the Repurchase Mandate is approved by the Shareholders.

SHARE REPURCHASES MADE BY THE COMPANY

The Company had not repurchased any of the Shares during the previous six months immediately preceding the Latest Practicable Date.

RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

At the Annual General Meeting, Mr. Wang Ya Nan, Dr. Yu Sun Say and Mr. Ting Leung Huel Stephen, will retire from office by rotation in accordance with article 108(A) of the Articles and will offer themselves for re-election to serve for another term. Details of the Directors proposed to be re-elected at the Annual General Meeting are set out below:

Mr. Wang Ya Nan ("Mr. YN Wang"), aged 65, is the Chairman and CEO of the Group. He is responsible for the overall strategic planning and business development of the Group. He is also responsible for the development of overseas markets. Mr. YN Wang was formerly a member of the National Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference ("CPPCC"). He is currently the Chairman and a non-executive Director of Tongda Hong Tai Holdings Limited (stock code: 2363) ("Tongda Hong Tai"), a company listed on The Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited (the "Stock Exchange"). He joined the Group in 1988 and has over 30 years of experience in the electronics and electrical industry. He graduated with a Executive Master of Business Administration degree in Xiamen University. He is a brother of Messrs. Wong Ah Yeung, Wong Ah Yu and Wang Ya Hua, who are substantial Shareholders. He is an uncle of Messrs. Wang Hung Man, Wong Ming Sik and Wong Ming Yuet, who are executive Directors.

Mr. YN Wang has a service contract with the Company for an initial term of three years and renewable automatically for successive term of one year, subject to retirement by rotation and re-election by the shareholders of the Company pursuant to the Articles. He is entitled to an annual emolument of HK\$1,200,000. The basis of determining Mr. YN Wang's said emolument is by reference to the market benchmark of emoluments and his performance with the Company.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, (a) Landmark Worldwide Holdings Limited directly owns 2,375,250,000 Shares, which represents approximately 24.44% of the Company's entire issued share capital, and 25% of the entire issued share capital of Landmark Worldwide Holdings Limited is held and beneficially owned by Mr. YN Wang, (b) E-Growth Resources Limited directly owns 444,000,000 Shares, which represents approximately 4.57% of the Company's entire issued share capital and the entire issued share capital of E-Growth Resources Limited is held and beneficially owned by Mr. YN Wang, and (c) Mr. YN Wang is directly interested in 691,395,000 Shares, representing approximately 7.11% of the Company's issued share capital.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. YN Wang (i) did not hold any directorship in any other public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas in the past three years, (ii) does not have any relationship with any other Directors, senior management or substantial or controlling Shareholders of the Company; and (iii) does not have any interest in the Shares within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO.

In relation to the re-election of Mr. YN Wang as an executive Director, there is no information which is discloseable nor is/was he involved in any of the matters required to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements of the provisions under Rule 13.51(2) and in particular, Rule 13.51(2) (h) to (v), of the Listing Rules, and there is no other matter which needs to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders.

Dr. Yu Sun Say ("Dr. Yu"), GBM, GBS, SBS, JP, aged 84, joined the Company as an independent non-executive Director in October 2007. Dr. Yu is the Chairman of the HKI Group. He is an independent non-executive director of Wong's International Holdings Limited (stock code: 99), Beijing Enterprises Holdings Limited (stock code: 392) and Fu Shek Financial Holdings Limited (stock code: 2263), all being companies listed on the main board of the Stock Exchange. He was formerly a member of Standing Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference, member of the Preparatory Committee of the Hong Kong Special Administrative Region and Hong Kong Affairs Adviser. He is currently the Permanent Honorary President of the Chinese General Chamber of Commerce and Permanent Honorary President of the Chinese Manufacturers' Association of Hong Kong.

Dr. Yu does not have a fixed term of office with the Company. The Director's emolument specified in his service contract is HK\$300,000 per annum. The basis of determining Dr. Yu's said emolument is by reference to the market benchmark of emoluments and his performance with the Company.

Save as disclosed above, Dr. Yu (i) did not hold any directorship in any other public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas in the past three years, (ii) does not have any interest in the Shares of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO and (iii) has no other positions held by him with the Company and its subsidiaries and has no relationship with any directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company.

In relation to the re-election of Dr. Yu as an independent non-executive Director of the Company, there is no information which is discloseable nor is/was he involved in any of the matters required to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements of the provisions under Rule 13.51(2) and in particular, Rule 13.51(2)(h) to (v), of the Listing Rules, and there is no other matter which needs to be brought to the attention of the Shareholders of the Company.

Dr. Yu has served as an independent non-executive Director for more than 9 years. The Board considered that he has been independent since his appointment as an independent non-executive Director according to the requirements as set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules; and he has no interest or transaction in the business of the Company, or any of its subsidiaries or holding company. Save as serving as an independent non-executive Director, he has not taken any other positions in the Company, or any of its subsidiaries or holding company. Therefore, the Board considered that he is still independent and recommended the Shareholders to re-elect him as independent non-executive Director.

Mr. Ting Leung Huel Stephen ("Mr. Ting"), MH, FCCA, FCPA (PRACTISING), ACA, CTA (HK), FHKI0D, aged 69, is an independent non-executive Director. Mr. Ting is the Chairman of Ting Ho Kwan & Chan, Certified Public Accountants. He is now a non-executive director of Chow Sang Sang (Holdings) International Limited (stock code: 116) and an independent non-executive director of six listed companies, namely, China SCE Property Holdings Limited (stock code: 1966), Computer and Technologies Holdings Limited (stock code: 46), Dongyue Group Limited (stock code: 189), Texhong International Group Limited (stock code: 2678), New Silkroad Culturaltainment Limited (stock code: 472) and Tong Ren Tang Technologies Company Limited (stock code: 1666). Save as disclosed above, Mr. Ting did not had any directorship in any other public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas in the past three years.

Mr. Ting was appointed as an independent non-executive director of the Company in December 2000. Apart from being an independent non-executive director of the Company. Mr. Ting does not hold any position with the Company or other members, of the Company's Group.

Mr. Ting does not have any relationships with any directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Ting is directly interested in 9,675,000 Shares, representing approximately 0.10% of the Company's issued share capital.

Mr. Ting has a service contract with the Company with an initial term of 3 years and renewable automatically for successive term of one year, subject to retirement by rotation and re-election by the shareholders of the Company pursuant to the articles of association of the Company. The director's emolument specified in his service contract is HK\$360,000 per annum. The basis of determining Mr. Ting's said emolument is by reference to the market benchmark of emoluments normally paid by other listed public companies in Hong Kong to their independent non-executive directors.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Ting (i) did not hold any directorship in any other public companies the securities of which are listed on any securities market in Hong Kong or overseas in the past three years, (ii) does not have any interest in the Shares of the Company within the meaning of Part XV of the SFO and (iii) has no other positions held by him with the Company and its subsidiaries and has no relationship with any directors, senior management or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company.

In relation to the re-election of Mr. Ting as an independent non-executive Director, there is no information which is discloseable nor is/was he involved in any of the matters required to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements of the provisions under Rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules, in particular, Rule 13.51(2)(h) to (v) of the Listing Rules, and there is no other matter which needs to be brought to the attention of the shareholders of the Company.

Notwithstanding Mr. Ting has existing commitments for being a non-executive director or an independent non-executive director for seven other listed companies in Hong Kong, the Board is of the view that Mr. Ting will be able to devote sufficient time to discharge his responsibilities as an independent non-executive Director of the Company on the basis that he possesses extensive experience in accounting field and has accumulated around 20 years of taking independent non-executive director position for listed companies in Hong Kong. Furthermore, Mr. Ting has confirmed to the Company that he is able to devote sufficient time to discharge his responsibilities as an independent non-executive Director.

Mr. Ting has served as an independent non-executive Director for more than 9 years. The Board considered that he has been independent since his appointment as an independent non-executive Director according to the requirements as set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules; and he has no interest or transaction in the business of the Company, or any of its subsidiaries or holding company. Save as serving as an independent non-executive Director, he has not taken any other positions in the Company, or any of its subsidiaries or holding company. Therefore, the Board considered that he is still independent and recommended the Shareholders to re-elect him as independent non-executive Director.

When identifying suitable candidates for directorship, the nomination committee of the Company carries out the selection process in accordance with the nomination policy of the Company and taking into account the diversity aspects (including without limitation, gender, age, cultural and educational background, ethnicity, professional experience, skills, knowledge and length of service), with due regard for the benefits of diversity policy of the Company. The nomination committee will also consider the Company's needs and other relevant statutory requirements and regulations required for the positions. All candidates must be able to meet the standards as set out in Rules 3.08 and 3.09 of the Listing Rules. A candidate who is to be appointed as an independent non-executive Director should also meet the independence criteria as set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules. Qualified candidates will then be recommended to the Board for approval.

APPOINTMENT OF INDEPENDENT NON-EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Pursuant to Code Provision B.2.4(b) of the Corporate Governance Code as set out in Appendix 14 of the Listing Rules (the "CG Code"), if all the independent non-executive directors of an issuer have served more than nine years on the board, the issuer should appoint a new independent non-executive director on the board at the forthcoming annual general meeting with effect from the financial year commencing on or after 1 January 2023.

As each of their tenure reached nine years, the Company will appoint an additional independent non-executive Director at the Annual General Meeting.

In consideration of the recommendation of the nomination committee of the Company, Mr. Sze Irons will be proposed at the Annual General Meeting to be appointed as an additional independent non-executive Director with effect from the conclusion of the Annual General Meeting. The nomination was made in accordance with the nomination policy of the Company and took into account the diversity aspects (including without limitation, gender, age, cultural and educational background, ethnicity, professional experience, skills, knowledge and length of service), with due regard for the benefits of diversity, as set out under the board diversity policy of the Company. The nomination committee also took into account the extensive knowledge and professional experience of Mr. Sze Irons, the profile of whom is set out below:

Mr. Sze Irons ("Mr. Sze"), B.B.S., J.P., aged 61, has extensive experience in investment and corporate management. Mr. Sze has been a director of Hang Tung Resources Limited, a private company in Hong Kong since March 1984. This company is principally engaged in property investment, import and export trading, provision of management services and share investments. He is principally responsible for the day-to-day management of its business operations and the overall strategic planning of the company.

Mr. Sze serves in various listed companies in Hong Kong. He has held the positions as follows:-

- (i) an independent non-executive director, a member of the audit committee and a member of the remuneration committee of Continental Holdings Limited, a company listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange (stock code: 513) since October 2008;
- (ii) an independent non-executive director of Chevalier International Holdings Limited, a company listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange (stock code: 25) since November 2016 and has been appointed as a member of the audit committee since February 2019;

- (iii) an independent non-executive director, the chairman of the nomination committee and a member of the audit committee of ST International Holdings Company Limited, a company listed on GEM of the Stock Exchange (stock code: 8521) since April 2018;
- (iv) an independent non-executive director, the chairman of the remuneration committee and a member of the audit committee of Best Mart 360 Holdings Limited, a company listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange (stock code: 2360) since December 2018;
- (v) an independent non-executive director, the chairman of the nomination committee, a member of the audit committee and a member of the remuneration committee of Jianzhong Construction Development Limited, a company listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange (stock code: 589) since February 2020;
- (vi) an independent non-executive director, a member of the audit committee, a member of the remuneration committee and a member of the nomination committee of Redco Healthy Living Company Limited, a company listed on the Main Board of the Stock Exchange (stock code: 2370) since March 2022; and

He is currently a standing member of The 14th National Committee of the Chinese People's Political Consultative Conference* ("CPPCC") (第十四屆中國人民政治協商會議全國委員會常務委員); a standing committee member of the Beijing Municipal Committee of the CPPCC* (中國人民政治協商會議北京市委員會常務委員); the chairman of the HKCPPCC (Provincial) Members Association Limited* (港區省級政協委員聯誼會會長); a member of the Labour Advisory Board of the Government of Hong Kong; the Permanent Honorary President of the Chinese Manufacturers' Association of Hong Kong; the deputy secretary general of The Hong Kong Coalition; the chairman of the Mainland Business Advisory Committee of the Hong Kong Trade Development Council; a council member of the Hong Kong Repertory Theatre; and a member of the University Court of The Hong Kong Polytechnic University. Mr. Sze was also elected as a member of the Election Committee of the Chief Executive of Hong Kong in 2016.

Mr. Sze graduated from the University of Wisconsin – La Crosse in the United States of America with a Bachelor of Science Degree in May 1985.

Notwithstanding Mr. Sze has existing commitments for being an independent non-executive director for seven other listed companies in Hong Kong, the Board is of the view that Mr. Sze will be able to devote sufficient time to discharge his responsibilities as an independent non-executive Director of the Company on the basis that he possesses extensive experience in accounting field and has accumulated more than 10 years' experience of taking independent non-executive director position for listed companies in Hong Kong. Furthermore, Mr. Sze has confirmed to the Company that he is able to devote sufficient time to discharge his responsibilities as an independent non-executive Director of the Company.

In the event that Mr. Sze is appointed as an independent non-executive Director at the Annual General Meeting, the Company will enter into a service contract with Mr. Sze, pursuant to which the appointment of Mr. Sze will be appointed for an initial term of 3 years and renewable automatically for successive term of one year, subject to retirement by rotation and re-election by the shareholders of the Company pursuant to the Articles. The director's emolument will be HK\$300,000 per annum, which is decided after considering the recommendation of the remuneration committee of the Company and by reference to the market benchmark of emoluments normally paid by other listed public companies in Hong Kong to their independent non-executive directors.

Mr. Sze does not have any relationship with any directors, senior management, or substantial or controlling shareholders of the Company.

As at the Latest Practicable Date, Mr. Sze is directly interested in 14,750,000 Shares, representing approximately 0.15% of the Company's issued share capital. Save as disclosed, Mr. Sze does not have, and is not deemed to have, any interests or short positions in the Shares, underlying Shares or debentures of the Company or any of its associated corporations which is required to be disclosed under Part XV of the SFO.

Save as disclosed above, Mr. Sze has not been a director of any other company listed in Hong Kong or overseas for the last three years. Mr. Sze has confirmed his independence with reference to the factors as set out in Rule 3.13 of the Listing Rules. Save as disclosed above, Mr. Sze has no information which is discloseable nor is/was he involved in any of the matters required to be disclosed pursuant to any of the requirements of the provisions under Rule 13.51(2) of the Listing Rules, in particular, Rule 13.51(2)(h) to (v) of the Listing Rules, and there is no other matter which needs to be brought to the attention of the shareholders of the Company.

PROPOSED ADOPTION OF AMENDED ARTICLES

In order to (i) bring the Articles in line with the relevant requirements of the applicable laws of the Cayman Islands and the Listing Rules, particularly to conform to the Core Standards as set out in Appendix 3 of the Listing Rules; (ii) provide flexibility to the Company in relation to the holding of hybrid and electronic meetings; and (iii) make other consequential and housekeeping amendments, and in view of the number of proposed changes, the Board proposes to put forward to the Shareholders for approval at the Annual General Meeting a special resolution to adopt the Amended Articles incorporating the proposed amendments to the Existing Articles as set out in Appendix I to this circular. The Company has been advised by its legal advisers that the Proposed Amendments conform to the requirements of the Listing Rules and do not violate the laws of the Cayman Islands, respectively. The Company also confirms that there is nothing unusual about the Proposed Amendments to the Articles for a company listed on the Stock Exchange. The proposed adoption of the Amended Articles is subject to the passing of a special resolution.

Major changes brought about by the Proposed Amendments include the following:

- to insert the definitions of "Companies Act", "electronic communication, "electronic meeting", "hybrid meeting", "Listing Rules", "Meeting Location", "physical meeting" and "Principal Meeting Place", among others, for use in the relevant provisions including new provisions relating to hybrid and electronic meetings and to update the relevant provisions in the Amended Articles in this regard;
- to allow all general meetings (including an annual general meeting, extraordinary general meeting or any adjourned or postponed meeting) to be held as physical meetings and at any meeting locations, as hybrid meetings or as electronic meetings, as may be determined by the Board in its absolute discretion;
- 3. to provide for the proceedings and requirements of general meetings which are held as a physical meetings and at any meeting locations, as hybrid meetings or as electronic meetings, and the powers of the Board and the chairman of the general meetings and ancillary provisions in relation to holding of such meetings;
- 4. to provide that the Company shall hold an annual general meeting in each financial year and such annual general meeting shall be held within 6 months after the end of the Company's financial year;
- 5. to provide that an annual general meeting of the Company must be called by notice in writing of not less than 21 clear days, while all other general meetings (including an extraordinary general meeting) shall be called by notice in writing of not less than 14 clear days but a general meeting may be called by shorter notice if it is so agreed under the circumstances set out in the Amended Articles;

- 6. to clarify that, in relation to the rights and powers that a person, who is authorised by a clearing house being a Shareholder to act as its representatives at any meeting of the Company, is entitled to exercise, include the right to speak and vote;
- 7. to allow, for quorum purposes only, two persons appointed by the clearing house as authorised representative or proxy to form a quorum for a general meeting of the Company for all purposes;
- 8. to provide that votes (whether on a show of hands or by way of poll) may be cast by such means, electronic or otherwise, as the Board or the chairman of the meeting may determine;
- 9. to provide that all Shareholders shall have the right to (i) speak at a general meeting; and (ii) vote at a general meeting except where a Shareholder is required, by the Listing Rules, to abstain from voting to approve the matter under consideration;
- 10. to allow the Company to provide an electronic address for the receipt of any document or information relating to proxies for a general meeting and ancillary provisions in relation thereto;
- 11. to provide that any person appointed by the Directors to fill a casual vacancy on or as an addition to the Board shall hold office until the first annual general meeting of the Company after his appointment and shall then be eligible for re-election;

- 14. to provide that the Directors may fill any casual vacancy in the office of Auditor and fix the remuneration of such Auditor, who shall hold office until the first annual general meeting of the Company after his appointment and shall then be subject to appointment by the Shareholders at such remuneration to be determined by the Shareholders in accordance with the Amended Articles;
- 15. to provide that the financial year end of the Company shall be the 31st of December in each year, unless otherwise determined by the Directors; and
- 16. to make other amendments to update, modify or clarify provisions and/or defined term(s) where the Board considers appropriate in accordance with or to better align with the wordings in the applicable laws of Cayman Islands and the Listing Rules.

RECOMMENDATION

The Directors have presently no intention to issue new Shares for the Company. The Directors believe that an exercise of the general mandate will enable the Company to take advantage of market conditions to raise additional capital for the Company.

The Repurchase Mandate may, depending on market conditions and funding arrangements at the time, lead to an enhancement of the net asset value per Share and/or earnings per Share and will only be made when the Directors believe that such repurchases of Shares will benefit the Company and the Shareholders.

An exercise of the Repurchase Mandate in full could have a material adverse impact on the working capital and gearing position of the Company compared with that as at 31 December 2022, being the date of its latest audited consolidated accounts. The Directors do not, however, intend to make any repurchase in circumstances that would have a material adverse impact on the working capital or gearing position of the Company.

The Directors believe that the general mandate to issue Shares and the Repurchase Mandate are beneficial to the Company and the Shareholders as a whole and accordingly recommend that all Shareholders should vote in favour of ordinary resolutions no. 4(A), 4(B) and 4(C) to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting.

The resolutions in relation to the re-election of Directors, the appointment of the independent non-executive Director, the Proposed Amendments and the adoption of the Amended Articles are proposed for the purpose of complying with the changes in the Listing Rules, among other things. Accordingly, the Directors recommend Shareholders to vote in favor of the above resolutions to be proposed at the Annual General Meeting.

In interpreting these Articles of Association, unless there be something in the subject or context inconsistent therewith:
 - "address" shall have the ordinary meaning given to it and shall include any facsimile number, electronic number or address or website used for the purposes of any communication pursuant to these Articles;

Without prejudice to any special rights or restrictions for the time being attaching to any sShares or any class of sShares, any sShare may be issued upon such terms and conditions and with such preferred, deferred or other special rights, or such restrictions, whether in regard to dividend, voting, return of capital or otherwise, as the Company may from time to time by Ordinary Resolution determine (or, in the absence of any such determination or so far as the same may not make specific provision, as the DirectorsBoard may determine) and any preference share may be issued on the terms that it is liable to be redeemed upon the happening of a specified event or upon a given date and either at the option of the Company, or at the option of the holder. No Shares shall be issued to bearer.
- 4. The <u>DirectorsBoard</u> may issue warrants to subscribe for any class of <u>sS</u>hares or <u>other</u> securities of the Company, which warrants may be issued on such terms as the <u>DirectorsBoard</u> may from time to time determine. - 7. The Company in general meeting may from time to time, whether or not all the sShares for the time being authorised shall have been issued and whether or not all the sShares for the time being issued shall have been fully paid up, by Ordinary Resolution increase its share capital by the creation of new sShares, such new capital to be of such amount and to be divided into sShares of such class or classes and of such amounts in Hong Kong dollars or United States dollars or such other currency as the sShareholders may think fit and as the resolution may prescribe.
- 8. Any new <u>sS</u>hares shall be issued upon such terms and conditions and with such rights, privileges or restrictions attached thereto as the general meeting resolving upon the creation thereof shall direct, and if no direction be given, subject to the

(Aa) The Company may at any time pay commission to any person for subscribing or agreeing to subscribe (whether absolutely or conditionally) for any shares in the CompanyShares or procuring or agreeing to procure subscriptions (whether absolute or conditional) for any shares in the CompanyShares, but so that the conditions and requirements of the Companies LawAct shall be observed and complied with, and in each case the commission shall not exceed ten per cent.10% of the price at which the sShares are issued.
 - (b)(B) if If any shares of the Company Shares are issued for the purpose of raising money to defray the expenses of the construction of any works or buildings or the provision of any plant which cannot be made profitable within a period of one year, the Company may pay interest on so much of that share capital as is for the time being paid up for the period and, subject to any conditions and restrictions mentioned in the Companies Law Act, may charge the sum so paid by way of interest to capital as part of the cost of construction of the works or buildings, or the provisions of the plant.

- 13. The Company may from time to time by Ordinary Resolution:
 - (a)(i) increase its share capital as provided by Article 7;
 - (b)(ii) consolidate or divide all or any of its share capital into sShares of larger or smaller amount than its existing sShares; and on any consolidation of fully paid <u>sS</u>hares into <u>sS</u>hares of larger amount, the <u>DirectorsBoard</u> may settle any difficulty which may arise as it thinks expedient and in particular (but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing) may as between the holders of sShares to be consolidated determine which particular sShares are to be consolidated into a consolidated <u>sS</u>hare, and if it shall happen that any person shall become entitled to fractions of a consolidated sShare or sShares, such fractions may be sold by some person appointed by the Directors Board for that purpose and the person so appointed may transfer the <u>sS</u>hares so sold to the purchaser thereof and the validity of such transfer shall not be questioned, and so that the net proceeds of such sale (after deduction of the expenses of such sale) may either be distributed among the persons who would otherwise be entitled to a fraction or fractions of a consolidated sShare or <u>sS</u>hares rateably in accordance with their rights and interest or may be paid to the Company for the Company's benefit;
 - (c)(iii) divide its <u>sS</u>hares into several classes and attach thereto respectively any preferential, deferred, qualified or special rights, privileges or conditions;
 - (d)(iv) sub-divide its sShares or any of them into sShares of smaller amount than is fixed by the Memorandum of Association, subject nevertheless to the provisions of the Companies LawAct, and so that the resolution whereby any sShare is sub-divided may determine that, as between the holders of the sShares resulting from such sub-division, one or more of the sShares may have any such preferred or other special rights over, or may have such deferred rights or be subject to any such restrictions as compared with the others as the Company has power to attach to unissued or new sShares;
 - (e)(v) cancel any sShares which at the date of the passing of the resolution have not been taken or agreed to be taken by any person, and diminish the amount of its share capital by the amount of the sShares so cancelled;
 - (<u>f</u>)(<u>vi</u>) make provision for the issue and allotment of <u>sS</u>hares which do not carry any voting rights; <u>and</u>

- (g)(vii) change the currency of denomination of its share capital; and.
- (viii) reduce its The Company may apply the share premium account in any manner authorised, and subject to any conditions prescribed by lawpermitted by the Companies Act. The Company shall at all times comply with the provisions of the Companies Act in relation to its share premium account.
- 14. The Company may by Special Resolution reduce its share capital or undistributable reserve in any manner authorised, and subject to any conditions prescribed, by law.

PURCHASE OF OWN SECURITIES

- 15. (a) Subject to the Statutes Companies Act, the power of the Company to purchase or otherwise acquire its sShares (including its redeemable shares) and warrants or other securities for the subscription or purchase of its own sShares (including redeemable shares) shall be exercisable by the Directors upon such terms and subject to such conditions as they think fit provided that, and any determination by the Board of the manner of purchase shall be deemed authorised by these Articles for purposes of the Companies Act. The Company is hereby authorised to make payments in respect of athe purchase of redeemable shares: its Shares out of capital or out of any other account or fund which can be authorised for this purpose in accordance with the Companies Act. The Directors may accept the surrender for no consideration of any fully paid Share.
 - (b) Subject to compliance with the Listing Rules and the rules and regulations of any other competent regulatory authority of the Relevant Territory, the Company may give financial assistance for the purpose of or in connection with a purchase made or to be made by any person of any Shares in the Company.
 - (c) The purchase or redemption of any Share shall not be deemed to give rise to the purchase or redemption of any other Share.

the price per share for purchases proposed to be made otherwise than by tender in the manner prescribed in (ii) below or on or through a stock exchange on which such shares are listed with the consent of the Company shall not exceed 100 per cent. of the average closing prices for dealings in one or more board lots of such shares on the principal stock exchange on which the shares are traded for the five trading days immediately before the date on which the purchase is made (whether conditionally or otherwise); and

(i) where any such purchase is proposed to be made by tender, tenders shall be made available to all holders of such shares on the same terms The holder of the Shares being purchased or redeemed shall be bound to deliver up to the Company at the Head Office or such other place as the Board shall specify the

certificate(s) thereof for cancellation and thereupon the Company shall pay to him the purchase or redemption monies in respect thereof.

REGISTER OF SHAREHOLDERS AND SHARE CERTIFICATES

- 16. Except as otherwise expressly provided by these Articles or as required by law or as ordered by a court of competent jurisdiction, no person shall be recognised by the Company as holding any <u>sS</u>hare upon any trust and, except as aforesaid, the Company shall not be bound by or be compelled in any way to recognise (even when having notice thereof) any equitable, contingent, future or partial interest in any <u>sS</u>hare or any interest in any fractional part of a <u>sS</u>hare or any other right or claim to or in respect of any <u>sS</u>hares except an absolute right to the entirety thereof of the registered holder.
- 17. (Aa) The Directors Board shall cause to be kept the Register and there shall be entered therein the particulars required under the Companies Law Act.
 - (b)(B) Subject to the provisions of the Companies LawAct, if the Directors-Board considers it necessary or appropriate, the Company may establish and maintain a local or branch register of sShareholders at such location as the Directors-Board thinks fit and, whileduring the issued share capital of the Company is, with the consent of the Directors, listed on any stock exchange in Hong-KongRelevant Period, the Company shall keep its principal or a branch register of sShareholders in Hong Kong.
 - (c)(C) For so long as any part of the share capital of the Company is listed on a stock exchange The Register and branch register of Shareholders maintained in Hong Kong, any memberas the case may inspect be, shall be open to inspection for at least two hours during business hours by Shareholders without charge or by any other person, upon a maximum payment of HK\$2.50 or such lesser sum specified by the Directors, at the Registered Office or such other place at which the principal *Register or branch *Register of the Company maintained in Hong Kong is kept in accordance with or without charge and require the provision to him of copies or extracts thereof in all respects as if the Company were incorporated under and is subject to the Companies Ordinance (Cap. 32 of the Laws of Hong Kong) provided any charge for inspection should be in line with the provisions of the Companies Ordinance the Companies Act or, if appropriate, upon a maximum payment of HK\$1.00 or such lesser sum specified by the Directors at the Registration Office.
- 18. (Aa) Share certificates Every person whose name is entered as a Shareholder in the Register shall be issuedentitled to receive within the relevant time limit as prescribed by in the Companies Law Act or as the applicable rules of the stock exchange in the Relevant Territory HK Stock Exchange may from time to time determine, whichever is the shorter, after allotment or, except in the case of a transfer which the Company is for the time being entitled to refuse to register and does not register, after lodgment of a transfer with the Company.
 - (B) Upon every transfer of shares lodgement of a transfer (or within such other period as the conditions of issue shall provide or is required by the Listing

Rules) one certificate held by the transferor shall be given up to be cancelled, and shall forthwith be cancelled accordingly, and a new certificate shall be issued to the transferee in respect of the shares transferred to him at such fee as is provided for all his Shares, or, if he shall so request, in a case where the allotment or transfer is of a number of Shares in paragraph (C)excess of this Article. If any of the shares included in the certificate so given up shall be retained by the transferor a new certificate for the balance shall be issued to him at the aforesaid fee payable by the transferor to the Company in respect thereof the number for the time being forming a stock exchange board lot for the purposes of the stock exchange of the Relevant Territory on which the Shares are listed upon payment of such sum (in the case of a transfer, not exceeding in the case of any share capital listed on a stock exchange in Hong Kong, HK\$2.50 or such other sum as may from time to time be allowed or not prohibited under the Listing Rules, and in the case of any other Shares, such sum in such currency as the Board may from time to time determine to be reasonable in the territory in which the relevant Register is situated, or otherwise such other sum as the Company may by Ordinary Resolution determine) for every certificate after the first as the Board may from time to time determine, such number of certificates for Shares in stock exchange board lots or whole multiples thereof as he shall request and one for the balance (if any) of the Shares in question, provided that in respect of a sShare or <u>sS</u>hares held jointly by several persons the Company shall not be bound to issue a certificate or certificates to each such person, and the issue and delivery of a certificate or certificates to one of the joint holders shall be sufficient delivery to all such holders.

(C) The fee referred to in paragraph (B) above shall be an amount not exceeding in the case of any share capital listed on a stock exchange in Hong Kong, HK\$2.50 or such other sum as may from time to time be allowed or not prohibited under the rules of the relevant stock exchange in Hong Kong, and in the case of any other shares, such sum in such currency as the Directors may from time to time determine to be reasonable in the territory in which the relevant register is situated, or otherwise such other sum as the Company may by Ordinary Resolution determine.

- (b)(D) The Company may, in the event of a change in the form of definitive share certificate adopted by the DirectorsBoard, issue new definitive certificates to all holders of <a href="Signature Signature Si
- 19. Every certificate for <u>sS</u>hares, warrants or debentures or representing any other form of securities of the Company shall be issued under the Seal-of the Company, which for this purpose may be a duplicate Seal or a securities seal.
- 20. Every share certificate hereafter issued shall specify the number and class of <u>sS</u>hares in respect of which it is issued and the amount paid thereon and may otherwise be in such form as the <u>DirectorsBoard</u> may from time to time prescribe. A share certificate shall relate to only one class of <u>sS</u>hares, and where the capital of the Company includes <u>sS</u>hares with different voting rights, the designation of each class of <u>sS</u>hares, other than those which carry the general right to vote at general meetings, must include the words "restricted voting" or "limited voting" or "non-voting" or some other appropriate designation which is commensurate with the rights attaching to the relevant class of <u>sS</u>hares.
- 21. (Aa) The Company shall not be bound to register more than four persons as joint holders of any sShare.
 - (b)(B) If any <u>sShares</u> shall stand in the names of <u>two2</u> or more persons, the person first named in the <u>rRegister</u> shall be deemed <u>theto be</u> sole holder thereof as regards service of notice and, subject to the provisions of these Articles, all or any other matter connected with the Company, except the transfer of the <u>sShare</u>.

22. If a share certificate is defaced, lost or destroyed, it may be replaced on payment of such fee, if any, (not exceeding, in the case of any share capital listed on a stock exchange in Hong Kong, HK\$2.50 or such other sum as may from time to time be allowed or not prohibited under the rules of the relevant stock exchange in Hong KongListing Rules, and, in the case of any other capital, such sum in such currency as the Directors Board may from time to time determine to be reasonable in the territory in which the relevant $\frac{1}{2}$ Register is situated, or such other sum as the Company may by Ordinary Resolution determine) as the Directors Board shall from time to time determine and on such terms and conditions, if any, as to publication of notices, evidence and indemnity as the Directors-Board thinks fit and in the case of wearing out or defacement, after delivery up of the old certificate. In the case of destruction or loss, the person to whom such replacement certificate is given shall also bear and pay to the Company all costs and out-of-pocket expenses incidental to the investigation by the Company of the evidence of such destruction or loss and of such indemnity.

LIEN

- 23. The Company shall have a first and paramount lien on every <u>sS</u>hare (not being a fully paid <u>sS</u>hare) for all moneys, whether presently payable or not, called or payable at a fixed time in respect of such-that sShare; and the Company shall also have a first and paramount lien and charge on all sShares (other than fully paid sharesup Shares) standing registered in the name of a sShareholder, whether singly or jointly with any other person or persons, for all the debts and liabilities of such <u>sS</u>hareholder or his estate to the Company and whether the same shall have been incurred before or after notice to the Company of any equitable or other interest of any person other than such <u>sS</u>hareholder, and whether the period for the payment or discharge of the same shall have actually arrived or not, and notwithstanding that the same are joint debts or liabilities of such <u>sS</u>hareholder or his estate and any other person, whether a sShareholder of the Company or not. The Company's lien (if any) on a <u>sS</u>hare shall extend to all dividends and bonuses declared in respect thereof. The Directors Board may at any time either generally or in any particular case waive any lien that has arisen, or declare any sShare to be exempt wholly or partially from the provisions of this Article.
- 24. The Company may sell, in such manner as the <u>Directors Board thinks</u> fit, any <u>sS</u>hares on which the Company has a lien, but no sale shall be made unless some sum in respect of which the lien exists is presently payable or the liability or engagement in respect of which such lien exists is liable to be presently fulfilled or discharged, nor until the expiration of <u>fourteen14</u> days after a notice in writing, stating and demanding payment of the sum presently payable or specifying the liability or engagement and demanding fulfilment or discharge thereof and giving notice of intention to sell in default, shall have been given, in the manner in which notices may be sent to <u>sS</u>hareholders of the Company as provided in these Articles, to the registered holder for the time being of the <u>sharesShares</u>, or the person entitled by reason of such holder's death, bankruptcy or winding-up to the <u>sS</u>hares.

25. The net proceeds of such sale after the payment of the costs of such sale shall be applied in or towards payment or satisfaction of the debt or liability or engagement in respect whereof the lien exists, so far as the same is presently payable, and any residue shall (subject to a like lien for debts or liabilities not presently payable as existed upon the sShares prior to the sale) be paid to the person entitled to the sShares at the time of the sale. For the purpose of giving effect to any such sale, the DirectorsBoard may authorise some person to transfer the sShares sold to the purchaser thereof and may enter the purchaser's name in the *Register as holder of the sShares, and the purchaser shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money, nor shall his title to the sShares be affected by any irregularity or invalidity in the proceedings relating to the sale.

CALLS ON SHARES

- 26. The Directors Board may from time to time make such calls as they may think it thinks fit upon the sShareholders in respect of any moneys unpaid on the sShares held by them respectively (whether on account of the nominal value of shares the Shares or by way of premiums) and not by the conditions of allotment thereof made payable at a fixed time. A call may be made payable either in one sum or by instalments.
- 27. FourteenAt least 14 days' notice at least of any call shall be given to the relevant Shareholders specifying the time and place of payment and to whom such call shall be paid.
- 28. A copy of the notice referred to in Article 27 shall be sent to <u>shareholders</u> relevant <u>Shareholders</u> in the manner in which notices may be sent to <u>sS</u>hareholders by the Company as herein provided.
- 29. In addition to the giving of notice in accordance with Article 28, notice of the person appointed to receive payment of every call and of the times and places appointed for payment may be given to the shareholders relevant Shareholders by notice to be inserted at least once in the Newspapers.
- 30. Every <u>sShareholder</u> upon whom a call is made shall pay the amount of every call so made on him to the person and at the time or times and place or places as the <u>DirectorsBoard</u> shall appoint.
- 31. A call shall be deemed to have been made at the time when the resolution of the <u>DirectorsBoard</u> authorising such call was passed.
- 32. The joint holders of a <u>sS</u>hare shall be severally as well as jointly liable for the payment of all calls and instalments due in respect of such <u>sS</u>hare or other moneys due in respect thereof.

- 33. The <u>DirectorsBoard</u> may from time to time at its discretion extend the time fixed for any call, and may extend such time as regards all or any of the <u>sS</u>hareholders, whom due to residence outside the Relevant Territory or other cause the <u>DirectorsBoard</u> may deem entitled to any such extension but no <u>sS</u>hareholder shall be entitled to any such extension except as a matter of grace and favour.
- 34. If the sum payable in respect of any call or instalment is not paid on or before the day appointed for payment thereof, the person or persons from whom the sum is due shall pay interest on the same at such rate not exceeding twenty per cent.20% per annum as the DirectorsBoard shall fix from the day appointed for the payment thereof to the time of the actual payment, but the DirectorsBoard may waive payment of such interest wholly or in part.
- 35. No <u>sS</u>hareholder shall be entitled to receive any dividend or bonus or to be present or vote (save as proxy <u>or authorised representative</u> for another <u>sS</u>hareholder) at any general meeting, either personally, or (save as proxy <u>or authorised representative</u> for another <u>sS</u>hareholder) by proxy, or be reckoned in a quorum, or to exercise any other privilege as a <u>sS</u>hareholder until all calls or instalments due from him to the Company, whether alone or jointly or jointly and severally with any other person, together with interest and expenses (if any) shall have been paid.
- 36. On the trial or hearing of any action or other proceedings for the recovery of any money due for any call, it shall be sufficient to prove that the name of the sShareholder sued is entered in the *Register as the holder, or one of the holders, of the sShares in respect of which such debt accrueds; that the resolution of the DirectorsBoard making the call has been duly recorded in the minute book of the DirectorsBoard; and that notice of such call was duly given to the sShareholder sued, in pursuance of these Articles; and it shall not be necessary to prove the appointment of the Directors who made such call, nor any other matters whatsoever, but the proof of the matters aforesaid shall be conclusive evidence of the debt.
- 37. (Aa) Any sum which by the terms of allotment of a sShare is made payable upon allotment or at any fixed date, whether on account of the nominal value of the sShare and/or by way of premium, shall for all purposes of these Articles be deemed to be a call duly made and notified and payable on the date fixed for payment, and in case of non-payment all the relevant provisions of these Articles as to payment of interest and expenses, forfeiture and the like, shall apply as if such sums had become payable by virtue of a call duly made and notified.
 - (b)(B) The <u>DirectorsBoard</u> may on the issue of <u>sS</u>hares differentiate between the allottees or holders as to the amount of calls to be paid and the time of payment.
- 38. The <u>DirectorsBoard</u> may, if <u>they it</u> thinks fit, receive from any <u>sS</u>hareholder willing to advance the same, and either in money or money's worth, all or any part of the

money uncalled and unpaid or instalments payable upon any sShares held by him, and in respect of all or any of the moneys so advanced the Company may pay interest at such rate (if any) not exceeding twenty per cent.20% per annum, as the DirectorsBoard may decide but a payment in advance of a call shall not entitle the sShareholder to receive any dividend or to exercise any other rights or privileges as a sShareholder in respect of the sShare or the due portion of the sShares upon which payment has been advanced by such sShareholder before it is called up. The DirectorsBoard may at any time repay the amount so advanced upon giving to such sShareholder not less than one mMonth's notice in writing of its intention inon that behalf, unless before the expiration of such notice the amount so advanced shall have been called up on the sShares in respect of which it was advanced.

TRANSFER OF SHARES

- 39. Subject to the Companies <u>LawAct</u>, all transfers of <u>sS</u>hares shall be effected by transfer in writing in the usual or common form or in such other form as the Directors may accept or (during the Relevant Period) in such standard form of transfer as shall be prescribed by the stock exchange in the Relevant Territory on which any of the securities of the Company are listed HK Stock Exchange and may be under hand only or, if the transferor or transferee is a clearing house Clearing House (or its nominee(s)), by under the Directors Board is proved from time to time.
- 40. The instrument of transfer of any sShare shall be executed by or on behalf of the transferor and by or on behalf of the transferee provided that the DirectorsBoard may dispense with the execution of the instrument of transfer by the transferor or the transferee or accept mechanically executed transfers in any case in which theyit in theirits absolute discretion thinks fit to do so. The transferor shall be deemed to remain the holder of the sShare until the name of the transferee is entered in the #Register in respect thereof. Nothing in these Articles shall preclude the DirectorsBoard from recognising a renunciation of the allotment or provisional allotment of any sShare by the allottee in favour of some other person.
- 41. (Aa) The Directors Board may, in their its absolute discretion, at any time and from time to time transfer, remove any sShare on the principal *Register to any branch register of shareholders Register or any sShare on any branch register of shareholders Register to the principal *Register or any other branch register of shareholders Register.

- (b)(B) Unless the DirectorsBoard otherwise agrees (which agreement may be on such terms and subject to such conditions as the DirectorsBoard in theirits absolute discretion may from time to time stipulate, and which agreement theyit shall, without giving any reason therefor, be entitled in theirits absolute discretion to give or withhold) no sShares on the principal tRegister shall be transferredremoved to any branch tRegister nor shall sShares on any branch tRegister be transferredremoved to the principal tRegister or any other branch tRegister and all transfersremovals and other documents of title relating to or affecting the title to any share or other securities of the Company shall be lodged for registration, and be registered, in the case of any sShares on a branch tRegister, at the relevant Registration Office, and, in the case of any sShares on the principal tRegister, at the Transfer Office. Unless the DirectorsBoard otherwise agrees, all transfers and other documents of title shall be lodged for registration with, and registered at, the relevant Registration Office.
- (c)(C) Notwithstanding anything contained in thiese Articles, the Company shall as soon as practicable and on a regular basis record in the principal #Register all transfersremovals of sShares effected on any branch #Register and shall at all times maintain the principal #Register and all branch #Registers in all respects in accordance with the Companies LawAct.
- (d) Notwithstanding the provisions of Articles 39 and 40 above, at all times during the Relevant Period, title to such listed Shares may be evidenced and transferred in accordance with the laws applicable to and the Listing Rules that are or shall be applicable to such listed Shares. The register of members of the Company in respect of its listed Shares (whether the Register or a branch Register) may be kept by recording the particulars required by Section 40 of the Companies Act in a form otherwise than legible if such recording otherwise complies with the laws applicable to and the Listing Rules that are or shall be applicable to such listed Shares.
- 42. The Directors Board however, may, in their its absolute discretion, refuse to register a transfer of any share (Share which is not being a fully paid up share) to a person of whom they do it does not approve or any sShare issued under any share option scheme for employees upon which a restriction on transfer imposed thereby still subsists, and they it may also refuse to register a transfer of any sShare (whether fully paid up or not) to more than four ip joint holders or a transfer of any sShares (not being a fully paid up sShare) on which the Company has a lien.

- 43. The <u>DirectorsBoard</u> may also decline to recognise any instrument of transfer unless: _
 - (a)(i) a fee of such sum, if any, (not exceeding, in the case of any share capital listed on a stock exchange in Hong Kong, HK\$2.50 or such other sum as maximum as the HK Stock Exchange may from time to time determine to be allowed or not prohibited under the rules of the relevant stock exchange in Hong Kong, and, in the case of any other capital, payable (or such lesser sum in such currency as the Directors Board may from time to time determine to be reasonable in the territory in which the relevant register is situate, or such other sum as the Company may by Ordinary Resolution determine) as the Directors shall from time to time determine require) has been paid to the Company;
 - (b)(ii) the instrument of transfer is lodged at the relevant Registration Office or, as the case may be, the Transfer Office accompanied by the certificate of the sShares to which it relates, and such other evidence as the DirectorsBoard may reasonably require to show the right of the transferor to make the transfer (and, if the instrument of transfer is executed by some other person on his behalf, the authority of that person so to do);
 - (c)(iii) the instrument of transfer is in respect of only one class of sShare;
 - (d)(iv) the sShares concerned are free of any lien in favour of the Company; and
 - (e)(v) if applicable, the instrument of transfer is properly stamped.
- 44. The <u>DirectorsBoard</u> may refuse to register a transfer of any <u>sS</u>hare to an infant or to a person of unsound mind or under other legal disability.
- 45. If the <u>DirectorsBoard</u> shall refuse to register a transfer of any <u>sS</u>hare, <u>theyit</u> shall, within two <u>mM</u>onths after the date on which the transfer was lodged with the Company, send to each of the transferor and the transferee notice of such refusal and, except where the subject <u>sS</u>hare is not a fully paid <u>sS</u>hare, the reason(s) for such refusal.
- 46. Upon every transfer of sharesShares, the certificate in respect thereof held by the transferor shall be given up to be cancelled, and shall forthwith be cancelled accordingly, and a new certificate shall be issued to the transferee in respect of the sShares transferred to him as provided in Article 18, and if any of the sShares included in the certificate so given up shall be retained by the transferor a new certificate in respect thereof shall be issued to him as provided in Article 18. The Company shall retain the instrument of transfer.

47. The registration of transfers may be suspended and the #Register closed, on giving notice by advertisement in the Newspapers or by any electronic means in such manner as may be accepted by the stock exchange in the Relevant Territory, at such times and for such periods as the DirectorsBoard may from time to time determine and either generally or in respect of any class of sShares, provided that the #Register shall not be closed for periods exceeding in the whole thirty30 days in any year. The period of 30 days may be extended for a further period or periods not exceeding 30 days in respect of any year if approved by the Shareholders by Ordinary Resolution.

TRANSMISSION OF SHARES

- 48. In the case of the death of a <u>sS</u>hareholder, the survivor or survivors where the deceased was a joint holder, and the legal personal representatives of the deceased where he was a sole or only surviving holder, shall be the only persons recognised by the Company as having any title to his interest in the <u>sS</u>hares; but nothing herein contained shall release the estate of a deceased holder (whether sole or joint) from any liability in respect of any <u>sS</u>hare solely or jointly held by him.
- 49. Any person becoming entitled to a <u>sS</u>hare in consequence of the death or bankruptcy or winding-up of a <u>sS</u>hareholder may, upon such evidence as to his title being produced as may from time to time be required by the <u>DirectorsBoard</u>, and subject as hereinafter provided, elect either to be registered himself as holder of the <u>sS</u>hare or to have some person nominated by him registered as the transferee thereof.
- 50. If the person becoming entitled to a <u>sS</u>hare pursuant to Article 49 shall elect to be registered himself as the holder of such <u>sS</u>hare, he shall deliver or send to the Company a notice in writing signed by him, at (unless the <u>DirectorsBoard</u> otherwise agrees) the Registration Office, stating that he so elects. If he shall elect to have his nominee registered, he shall testify his election by executing a transfer of such <u>sS</u>hare to his nominee. All the limitations, restrictions and provisions of these <u>presentsArticles</u> relating to the right to transfer and the registration of transfers of <u>sS</u>hares shall be applicable to any such notice or transfer as aforesaid as if the death, bankruptcy or winding-up of the <u>sS</u>hareholder had not occurred and the notice or transfer were a transfer executed by such <u>sS</u>hareholder.
- 51. A person becoming entitled to a <u>sS</u>hare by reason of the death, bankruptcy or winding-up of the holder shall be entitled to the same dividends and other advantages to which he would be entitled if he were the registered holder of the <u>sS</u>hare. However, the <u>DirectorsBoard</u> may, if <u>they it</u> thinks fit, withhold the payment of any dividend payable or other advantages in respect of such <u>sS</u>hare until such person shall become the registered holder of the <u>sS</u>hare or shall have effectually transferred such <u>sS</u>hare, but, subject to the requirements of Article <u>8076</u> being met, such a person may vote at general meetings of the Company.

FORFEITURE OF SHARES

- 52. If a <u>sS</u>hareholder fails to pay any call or instalment of a call on the day appointed for payment thereof, the <u>DirectorsBoard</u> may, at any time thereafter during such time as any part of the call or instalment remains unpaid, without prejudice to the provisions of Article 354, serve notice on him requiring payment of so much of the call or instalment as is unpaid, together with any interest which may have accrued and which may still accrue up to the date of actual payment.
- 53. The notice shall name a further day (not earlier than the expiration of fourteen14 days from the date of the notice) on or before which the payment required by the notice is to be made, and it shall also name the place where payment is to be made such place being the Registered Office or a Registration Office or another place within the Relevant Territory. The notice shall also state that, in the event of non-payment at or before the time appointed, the s\int hares in respect of which the call was made will be liable to be forfeited.
- 54. If the requirements of any such notice as aforesaid are not complied with, any sShare in respect of which the notice has been given may at any time thereafter, before the payment required by the notice has been made, be forfeited by a resolution of the DirectorsBoard to that effect. Such forfeiture shall include all dividends and bonuses declared in respect of the forfeited sShare and not actually paid before the forfeiture. The DirectorsBoard may accept the surrender of any sShare liable to be forfeited hereunder and in such cases references in these Articles to forfeiture shall include surrender.
- 55. Any <u>sS</u>hare so forfeited shall be deemed to be the property of the Company, and may be re-allotted, sold or otherwise disposed of on such terms and in such manner as the <u>Directors-Board</u> thinks fit and at any time before a sale or disposition, the forfeiture may be cancelled on such terms as the <u>Directors-Board</u> thinks fit.
- 56. A person whose <u>sS</u>hares have been forfeited shall cease to be a <u>sS</u>hareholder in respect of the forfeited sShares, but shall, notwithstandingnevertheless, remain liable to pay to the Company all moneys which, at the date of forfeiture, were payable by him to the Company in respect of the forfeited $s\underline{S}$ hares, together with (if the Directors Board shall in their its discretion so require) interest thereon from the date of forfeiture until the date of actual payment (including the payment of such interest) at such rate not exceeding twenty per cent-20% per annum as the Directors Board may prescribe, and the Directors Board may enforce the payment thereof if they it thinks fit, and without any deduction or allowance for the value of the sShares at the date of forfeiture, but his liability shall cease if and when the Company shall have received payment in full of all such moneys in respect of the <u>sS</u>hares. For the purposes of this Article any sum which by the terms of issue of a $s\underline{S}$ hare, is payable thereon at a fixed time which is subsequent to the date of forfeiture, whether on account of the nominal value of the sShare or by way of premium, shall notwithstanding that such time has not yet arrived be deemed to be payable on the date of forfeiture, and the same shall become due and payable immediately upon the forfeiture, but interest thereon shall only be payable in respect of any period between the said fixed time and the date of actual payment.

- 57. A certificate in writing that the declarant is a Director or the Secretary, and that a share in the CompanyShare has been duly forfeited or surrendered on a date stated in the certificate, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts therein stated as against all persons claiming to be entitled to the sShare. The Company may receive the consideration, if any, given for the sShare on any re-allotment, sale or disposition thereof and may execute a transfer of the sShare in favour of the person to whom the sShare is re-allotted, sold or disposed of and such person shall thereupon be registered as the holder of the sShare, and shall not be bound to see to the application of the subscription or purchase money, if any, nor shall his title to the sShare be affected by any irregularity or invalidity in the proceedings in reference to the forfeiture, re-allotment, sale or disposal of the such sShare.
- 58. When any sShare shall have been forfeited, notice of the forfeiture shall be given to the sShareholder in whose name it stood immediately prior to the forfeiture, and an entry of the forfeiture, with the date thereof, shall forthwith be made in the *Register, but no forfeiture shall be in any manner invalidated by any omission or neglect to give such notice or make any such entry.
- 59. Notwithstanding any such forfeiture as aforesaid the <u>DirectorsBoard</u> may at any time, before any <u>sS</u>hares so forfeited shall have been sold, re-allotted or otherwise disposed of, cancel the forfeiture on such terms as <u>the Directors thinkit thinks</u> fit or permit the <u>sS</u>hares so forfeited to be bought back or redeemed upon the terms of payment of all calls and interest due upon and expenses incurred in respect of the <u>sS</u>hares, and upon such further terms (if any) as <u>they-it</u> thinks fit.
- 60. The forfeiture of a <u>sS</u>hare shall not prejudice the right of the Company to any call already made or any instalment payment thereon.
- 61. (Aa) The provisions of these Articles as to forfeiture shall apply in the case of non-payment of any sum which, by terms of issue of a sShare, becomes payable at a fixed time, whether on account of the nominal value of the sShare or by way of premium, as if the same had been payable by virtue of a call duly made and notified.
 - (b)(B) in In the event of a forfeiture of sShares the sShareholder shall be bound to deliver and shall forthwith deliver to the Company the certificate or certificates held by him for the sShares so forfeited and in any event the certificates representing sShares so forfeited shall be void and of no further effect.

GENERAL MEETINGS

- 62. At all times during the Relevant Period (but not otherwise) the Company shall in each <u>financial</u> year hold a general meeting as its annual general meeting in addition to any other meeting in that <u>financial</u> year and shall specify the meeting as such in the notice calling it; and not more than fifteen months such annual general meeting must be held within 6 Months after the end of the Company's financial year (or such longer period as may be permitted by the rules of the stock exchange on which any securities of the Company are listed with the permission of the Company)-shall elapse between the date of one.
- 63. All general meetings other than annual general meetings shall be called extraordinary general meetings. All general meetings other than annual general meeting of the Company and that of the next. Themeetings shall be called extraordinary general meetings. All general meetings (including an annual general meeting shall, extraordinary general meeting, any adjourned meeting or postponed meeting) may be held as a physical meeting in the Relevant Territory or elsewhere as may be determined by the Directors and at such time and place as the Directors shall appoint A meeting of the shareholders or any class thereof may be held by means of such telephone, electronic or other communication facilities as permit all persons participating in the meeting to communicate with each other simultaneously and instantaneously, and participation in such a meeting shall constitute presence in person at such meeting in any part of the world and at one or more locations as provided in Article 71A, as a hybrid meeting or as an electronic meeting, as may be determined by the Board in its absolute discretion.
- 64. The Directors Board may, whenever they it thinks fit, convene an Eextraordinary Ggeneral Mmeeting. Extraordinary Ggeneral Mmeetings shall also be convened on the requisition of one or more sShareholders holding, at the date of deposit of the requisition, not less than one tenth of the paid up capital of the Company having the right of voting at general meetings, on a one vote per Share basis. Such requisition shall be made in writing to the Directors Board or the Secretary for the purpose of requiring an Eextraordinary General Mmeeting to be called by the Directors Board for the transaction of any business or resolution specified in such requisition. Such meeting shall be held within two-2 mM onths after the deposit of such requisition. If within 21 days of such deposit, the Directors Board fails to proceed to convene such meeting, the requisitionist(s) himself (themselves) may do so in the same mannerconvene a physical meeting at only one location which will be the Principal Meeting Place, and all reasonable expenses incurred by the requisitionist(s) as a result of the failure of the Directors Board shall be reimbursed to the requisitionist(s) by the Company.

- 65. An annual general meeting and a meeting called for the passing of a Special Resolution shallmust be called by at least twenty one days' notice in writing, and a meeting of the Companyof not less than 21 clear days. All other thangeneral meetings (including an annualextraordinary general meeting-or a meeting for the passing of a Special Resolution shall) must be called by at least fourteen days' notice in writing of not less than 14 clear days. The notice shall be exclusive of the day on which it is served or deemed specify (a) the day and the hour of meeting, (b) save for an electronic meeting, the place of the meeting and if there is more than one meeting location as determined by the Board pursuant to Article 71A the principal place of the meeting (the "Principal Meeting Place"), (c) if the general meeting is to be serveda hybrid meeting or an electronic meeting, the notice shall include a statement to that effect and with details of the dayelectronic facilities for which it is given, and shall specify the placeattendance and participation by electronic means at the meeting or where such details will be made available by the Company prior to the meeting, the day and the hour of meeting and, (d) particulars of the resolutions to be considered at that meeting and in case of special business (as defined in Article 67), the general nature of that business and particulars of the resolutions to be considered, and shall be given, in manner hereinafter mentioned or in such other manner, if any, as may be prescribed by the Company in general meeting, to such persons as are, under these Articles, entitled to receive such notices from the Company, provided that a meeting of the Company shall notwithstanding that it is called by shorter notice than that specified in this Article be deemed to have been duly called if it is so agreed:
 - (a)(i) in the case of a meeting called as the annual general meeting, by all the <u>sS</u>hareholders entitled to attend and vote thereat; and
 - (b)(ii) in the case of any other meeting, by a majority in number of the <u>sS</u>hareholders having a right to attend and vote at the meeting, being a majority together holdingrepresenting not less than ninety five per cent. in nominal value of the shares giving that right95% of the total voting rights at the meeting of all the Shareholders.
- 66. (Aa) The accidental omission to give any notice to, or the non-receipt of any notice by, any person entitled to receive notice shall not invalidate any resolution passed or any proceedings at any such meeting.
 - (b)(B) In the case where forms of proxy or notice of appointment of corporate representative are to be sent out with any notice, the accidental omission to send such forms of proxy or notice of appointment of corporate representative to, or the non-receipt of such forms by, any person entitled to receive notice of the relevant meeting shall not invalidate any resolution passed or any proceeding at any such meeting.

PROCEEDINGS AT GENERAL MEETINGS

- 67. (Aa) All business shall be deemed special that is transacted at an extraordinary general meeting, and also all business shall be deemed special that is transacted at an annual general meeting with the exception of the following, which shall be deemed ordinary business:-
 - (i) the declaration and sanctioning of dividends—;
 - (ii) the reading, considering consideration and adoptiong of the accounts and balance sheets and the reports of the Directors and Auditors and other documents required to be annexed to the balance sheet, sheets;
 - (iii) the election of Directors and appointment of Auditors and other officers in the place of those retiring—;
 - (iv) the fixing appointment of or delegation of power to the Directors to fix the remuneration of the Auditors,; and
 - (v) the votfixing of, or delegation the determining of power to the Directors to fix the ordinary or extra or special method of fixing of the remuneration to the Directors, the grant of a general mandate toof the Directors to allot, issue or deal with shares and to enter into agreements for such purposes, and the grant of a general mandate authorising Directors to exercise the power of the Company to repurchase its own securities and of the Auditors.
 - (b)(B) During the Relevant Period (but not otherwise), neither the Memorandum of Association nor these Articles may be altered except by a Special Resolution.
- 68. For all purposes the quorum for a general meeting shall be two-2 sShareholders present in person (or, in the case of a sShareholder being a corporation, by its duly authorised representative) or by proxy or, for quorum purposes only, two persons appointed by the clearing house as authorised representative or proxy, and entitled to vote. No business shall be transacted at any general meeting unless the requisite quorum shall be present at the commencement when the meeting proceeds to business and continues to be present until the conclusion of the meeting.

- 69. If within fifteen15 minutes (or such longer time not exceeding one hour as the chairman of the meeting may determine to wait) from the time appointed for the meeting a quorum is not present, the meeting, if convened upon the requisition of schareholders, shall be dissolved, but in any other case it shall stand adjourned to the same day in the next week and at such the same time and (where applicable) same place as shall be decided by the Directors, and if(s) or to such time and (where applicable) such place(s) and in such form and manner referred to Article 63 as the chairman of the meeting (or in default, the Board) may absolutely determine. If at such adjourned meeting a quorum is not present within fifteen15 minutes from the time appointed for holding the meeting, the shareholder or his representative or proxy present (if the Company has only one shareholder), or the shareholders present in person (or, in the case of a shareholder being a corporation, by its duly authorised representative) or by proxy and entitled to vote shall be a quorum and may transact the business for which the meeting was called shall be dissolved.
- 70. (a) The Chairman (if any) of the Board or, if heor if there is absent or declines to take the chair at such meeting, the Deputy Chairman (if any)more than one Chairman, any one of them as may be agreed amongst themselves or failing such agreement, any one of them elected by all the Directors present, shall take the preside as chairman at everya general meeting, or, if there be no such. If at any meeting no chairman is present within fifteen (15) minutes after the time appointed for holding the meeting, or is willing to act as chairman, the Deputy Chairman or Vice Chairman or if there is more than one Deputy Chairman or Vice Chairman, or one of them as may be agreed amongst themselves or failing such agreement, if at any general meeting neither of such one of them elected by all the Directors present shall preside as chairman. If no Chairman or Deputy Chairman or Vice Chairman is present within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for holding such meeting, or both such persons decline to take is present or is willing to act as chairman of the chair at such meeting, the Directors present shall choose one of their number as Chairman of the meetingto act, andor if noone Director beonly is present or if all the Directors present declinehe shall preside as chairman if willing to act. If no Director is present, or if each of the Directors present declines to take the chair, or if the Echairman chosen shall retire from the chair, then-the sShareholders present shall choose in person or by proxy and entitled to vote <u>shall elect</u> one of their number to be \subseteq chairman of the meeting.
 - (b) If the chairman of a general meeting held in any form is participating in the general meeting using an electronic facility or facilities which is hereby permitted and becomes unable to participate in the general meeting using such electronic facility or facilities, another person (determined in accordance with Article 70(a) above) shall preside as chairman of the meeting unless and until the original chairman of the meeting is able to participate in the general meeting using the electronic facility or facilities.
- 71. The Subject to Article 71C, the Chairman of the meeting may, (with out the consent of any general the meeting at which a quorum is present, and shall, if so directed by) or

shall at the direction of the meeting, adjourn any meeting from time to time (or indefinitely) and/or from place to place(s) and/or from one form to another (a physical meeting, a hybrid meeting or an electronic meeting) as the meeting shall determine. Whenever a meeting is adjourned for fourteen14 days or more, at least seven7 clear days' notice, specifying the place, the day and the hour of the adjourned meeting shall be given in the same manner as in the case of an original meetingdetails set out in Article 65 but it shall not be necessary to specify in such notice the nature of the business to be transacted at the adjourned meeting. Save as aforesaid, no notice of an adjournment or of the business to be transacted at any adjourned meeting needs to be given nor shall any sShareholder be entitled to any such notice. No business shall be transacted at an adjourned meeting other than the business which might have been transacted at the meeting from which the adjournment took place.

- 71A. (1) The Board may, at its absolute discretion, arrange for persons entitled to attend a general meeting to do so by simultaneous attendance and participation by means of electronic facilities at such location or locations ("Meeting Location(s)") determined by the Board at its absolute discretion. Any Shareholder or any proxy attending and participating in such way or any Shareholder or proxy attending and participating in an electronic meeting or a hybrid meeting by means of electronic facilities is deemed to be present at and shall be counted in the quorum of the meeting.
 - (2) All general meetings are subject to the following and, where appropriate, all references to a "Shareholder" or "Shareholders" in this sub-paragraph (2) shall include a proxy or proxies respectively:
 - (i) where a Shareholder is attending a Meeting Location and/or in the case of a hybrid meeting, the meeting shall be treated as having commenced if it has commenced at the Principal Meeting Place;
 - (ii) Shareholders present in person or by proxy at a Meeting Location and/or Shareholders attending and participating in an electronic meeting or a hybrid meeting by means of electronic facilities shall be counted in the quorum for and entitled to vote at the meeting in question, and that meeting shall be duly constituted and its proceedings valid provided that the chairman of the meeting is satisfied that adequate electronic facilities are available throughout the meeting to ensure that Shareholders at all Meeting Locations and Shareholders participating in an electronic meeting or a hybrid meeting by means of electronic facilities are able to participate in the business for which the meeting has been convened;
 - (iii) where Shareholders attend a meeting by being present at one of the Meeting Locations and/or where Shareholders participating in an electronic meeting or a hybrid meeting by means of electronic facilities, a failure (for any reason) of the electronic facilities or communication equipment, or any other failure in the arrangements for enabling those

in a Meeting Location other than the Principal Meeting Place to participate in the business for which the meeting has been convened or in the case of an electronic meeting or a hybrid meeting, the inability of one or more Shareholders or proxies to access, or continue to access, the electronic facilities despite adequate electronic facilities having been made available by the Company, shall not affect the validity of the meeting or the resolutions passed, or any business conducted thereat or any action taken pursuant to such business provided that there is a quorum present throughout the meeting; and

- (iv) if any of the Meeting Locations is not in the same jurisdiction as the Principal Meeting Place and/or in the case of a hybrid meeting, the provisions of these Articles concerning the service and giving of notice for the meeting, and the time for lodging proxies, shall apply by reference to the Principal Meeting Place; and in the case of an electronic meeting, the time for lodging proxies shall be as stated in the notice for the meeting.
- 71B. The Board and, at any general meeting, the chairman of the meeting may from time to time make arrangements for managing attendance and/or participation and/or voting at the Principal Meeting Place, any Meeting Location(s) and/or participation in an electronic meeting or a hybrid meeting by means of electronic facilities (whether involving the issue of tickets or some other means of identification, passcode, seat reservation, electronic voting or otherwise) as it shall in its absolute discretion consider appropriate, and may from time to time change any such arrangements, provided that a Shareholder who, pursuant to such arrangements, is not entitled to attend, in person or by proxy, at any Meeting Location shall be entitled so to attend at one of the other Meeting Locations; and the entitlement of any Shareholder so to attend the meeting or adjourned meeting or postponed meeting at such Meeting Location or Meeting Locations shall be subject to any such arrangement as may be for the time being in force and by the notice of meeting or adjourned meeting or postponed meeting stated to apply to the meeting.

71C. If it appears to the chairman of the general meeting that:

- (a) the electronic facilities at the Principal Meeting Place or at such other Meeting Location(s) at which the meeting may be attended have become inadequate for the purposes referred to in Article 71A(1) or are otherwise not sufficient to allow the meeting to be conducted substantially in accordance with the provisions set out in the notice of the meeting;
- (b) in the case of an electronic meeting or a hybrid meeting, electronic facilities being made available by the Company have become inadequate;
- (c) it is not possible to ascertain the view of those present or to give all persons entitled to do so a reasonable opportunity to communicate and/or vote at the meeting; or
- (d) there is violence or the threat of violence, unruly behaviour or other disruption occurring at the meeting or it is not possible to secure the proper and orderly conduct of the meeting;

then, without prejudice to any other power which the chairman of the meeting may have under these Articles or at common law, the chairman may, at his/her absolute discretion, without the consent of the meeting, and before or after the meeting has started and irrespective of whether a quorum is present, interrupt or adjourn the meeting (including adjournment for indefinite period). All business conducted at the meeting up to the time of such adjournment shall be valid.

71D. The Board and, at any general meeting, the chairman of the meeting may make any arrangement and impose any requirement or restriction the Board or the chairman of the meeting, as the case may be, considers appropriate to ensure the security and orderly conduct of a meeting (including, without limitation, requirements for evidence of identity to be produced by those attending the meeting, the searching of their personal property and the restriction of items that may be taken into the meeting place, determining the number and frequency of and the time allowed for questions that may be raised at a meeting). Shareholders shall also comply with all requirements or restrictions imposed by the owner of the premises at which the meeting is held. Any decision made under this Article shall be final and conclusive and a person who refuses to comply with any such arrangements, requirements or restrictions may be refused entry to the meeting or ejected (physically or electronically) from the meeting.

- 71E. If, after the sending of notice of a general meeting but before the meeting is held, or after the adjournment of a meeting but before the adjourned meeting is held (whether or not notice of the adjourned meeting is required), the Directors, in their absolute discretion, consider that it is inappropriate, impracticable, unreasonable or undesirable for any reason to hold the general meeting on the date or at the time or place or by means of electronic facilities specified in the notice calling the meeting, they may change or postpone the meeting to another date, time and/or place and/or change the electronic facilities and/or change the form of the meeting (a physical meeting, an electronic meeting or a hybrid meeting) without approval from the Shareholders. Without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, the Directors shall have the power to provide in every notice calling a general meeting the circumstances in which a postponement of the relevant general meeting may occur automatically without further notice, including without limitation where a number 8 or higher typhoon signal, black rainstorm warning or other similar event is in force at any Meeting Location at any time on the day of the meeting. This Article shall be subject to the following:
 - (a) when a meeting is so postponed, the Company shall endeavour to post a notice of such postponement on the Company's website as soon as practicable (provided that failure to post such a notice shall not affect the automatic postponement of a meeting);
 - (b) when only the form of the meeting or electronic facilities specified in the notice are changed, the Board shall notify the Shareholders of details of such change in such manner as the Board may determine;
 - (c) when a meeting is postponed or changed in accordance with this Article, subject to and without prejudice to Article 71, unless already specified in the original notice of the meeting, the Board shall fix the date, time, place (if applicable) and electronic facilities (if applicable) for the postponed or changed meeting and shall notify the Shareholders of such details in such manner as the Board may determine; further all proxy forms shall be valid (unless revoked or replaced by a new proxy) if they are received as required by these Articles not less than 48 hours before the time of the postponed meeting; and
 - (d) notice of the business to be transacted at the postponed or changed meeting shall not be required, nor shall any accompanying documents be required to be recirculated, provided that the business to be transacted at the postponed or changed meeting is the same as that set out in the original notice of general meeting circulated to the Shareholders.

- 71F. All persons seeking to attend and participate in an electronic meeting or a hybrid meeting shall be responsible for maintaining adequate facilities to enable them to do so. Subject to Article 71C, any inability of a person or persons to attend or participate in a general meeting by way of electronic facilities shall not invalidate the proceedings of and/or resolutions passed at that meeting.
- 71G. Without prejudice to other provisions in Article 71, a physical meeting may also be held by means of such telephone, electronic or other communication facilities to permit all persons participating in the meeting to communicate with each other simultaneously and instantaneously, and participation in such a meeting shall constitute presence in person at such meeting.
- 72. (A)Subject to any special rights or restrictions as to voting for the time being attached to any shares by or in accordance with these Articles, at any general meeting on a poll every shareholder present in person or by proxy or, in the case of a shareholder being a corporation, by its duly authorised representative shall have one vote for every fully paid share of which he is the holder but so that no amount paid up or credited as paid up on a share in advance of calls or instalments is treated for the foregoing purposes as paid up on the share. A resolution put to the vote of a meeting shall be decided by way of a poll save that the chairman of the meeting may in good faith, allow a resolution which relates purely to a procedural or administrative matter to be voted on by a show of hands in which case every shareholder present in person (or being a corporation, is present by a duly authorized representative), or by proxy(ies) shall have one vote provided that where more than one proxy is appointed by a shareholder which is a clearing house (or its nominee(s)), each such proxy shall have one vote on a show of hands. For purposes of this Article, procedural and administrative matters are those that (i) are not on the agenda of the general meeting or in any supplementary circular that may be issued by the Company to its shareholders; and (ii) relate to the Chairman's duties to maintain the orderly conduct of the meeting and/or allow the business of the meeting to be properly and effectively dealt with, whilst allowing all shareholders a reasonable opportunity to express their views.
 - (B) Where a show of hands is allowed, before or on the declaration of the result of the show of hands, a poll may be demanded:
 - (a) by at least three shareholders present in person or in the case of a shareholder being a corporation by its duly authorised representative or by proxy for the time being entitled to vote at the meeting; or

- (b) by a shareholder or shareholders present in person or in the case of a shareholder being a corporation by its duly authorised representative or by proxy and representing not less than one tenth of the total voting rights of all shareholders having the right to vote at the meeting; or
- (c) by a shareholder or shareholders present in person or in the case of a shareholder being a corporation by its duly authorised representative or by proxy and holding shares in the Company conferring a right to vote at the meeting being shares on which an aggregate sum has been paid up equal to not less than one tenth of the total sum paid up on all shares conferring that right.

A demand by a person as proxy for a shareholder or in the case of a shareholder being a corporation by its duly authorised representative shall be deemed to be the same as a demand by the shareholder.

Where a resolution is voted on by a show of hands, a declaration by the chairman of the meeting that a resolution has been carried, or carried unanimously, or by a particular majority, or not carried by a particular majority, or lost, and an entry to that effect made in the minute book containing the minutes of the proceedings of the Company, shall be conclusive evidence of the facts without proof of the number or proportion of the votes recorded foriging-the-sult-in-favour or against the-sult-in-favour or agains

VOTES OF SHAREHOLDERS

(a) Subject to any special rights, privileges or restrictions as to voting for the time being attached to any class or classes of sShares, at any general meeting on a show of hands every shareholder who is present in person (or, in the case of a shareholder being a corporation, by its duly authorised representative) or by proxy shall (save as provided otherwise in this Article) have one vote, and on a-poll every sShareholder present in person (or, in the case of a sShareholder being a corporation, by its duly authorised representative) or by proxy, shall have one vote for every sShare of which he is the holder which is fully paid or credited as fully paid (but so that no amount paid or credited as paid on a sShare in advance of calls or instalments shall be treated for the purposes of this Article as paid on the sShare). On a poll a sShareholder entitled to more than one vote need not use all his votes or cast all his votes in the same way. A resolution put to the vote of a meeting shall be decided by way of a poll save that the chairman of the meeting may, in good faith, allow a resolution which relates purely to a procedural or administrative matter to be voted on by a show of hands, in which case every Shareholder present in person (or being a corporation, is present by a duly authorized representative) or by proxy(ies) shall have one vote provided that where more than one proxy is appointed by a Shareholder which is a clearing house (or its nominee(s)), each such proxy shall have one vote on a show of hands. For purposes of this Article, procedural and administrative matters are those that (i) are not on the agenda of the general meeting or in any supplementary circular that may be issued by the Company to its Shareholders; and (ii) relate to the chairman's duties to maintain the orderly conduct of the meeting and/or allow the business of the meeting to be properly and effectively dealt with, whilst allowing all Shareholders a reasonable opportunity to express their views.  - (i) by at least three Shareholders present in person or by proxy for the time being entitled to vote at the meeting;
 - (ii) by a Shareholder or Shareholders present in person or by proxy and representing not less than one-tenth of the total voting rights of all the Shareholders having the right to vote at the meeting; or
 - (iii) by any Shareholder or Shareholders present in person or by proxy and holding Shares in the Company conferring a right to vote at the meeting being Shares on which an aggregate sum has been paid up equal to not less than one-tenth of the total sum paid up on all the Shares conferring that right.

A demand by a person as proxy for a Shareholder or in the case of a Shareholder being a corporation by its duly authorised representative shall be deemed to be the same as a demand by the Shareholder.

- <u>76.80.</u> Any person entitled under Article 51 to be registered as the holder of any <u>sS</u>hares may vote at any general meeting in respect thereof in the same manner as if he were the registered holder of such <u>sS</u>hares, provided that at least 48 hours before the time of the holding of the meeting or adjourned <u>meeting or postponed</u> meeting (as the case may be) at which he proposes to vote, he shall satisfy the <u>DirectorsBoard</u> of his right to be registered as the holder of such <u>sS</u>hares or the <u>DirectorsBoard</u> shall have previously admitted his right to vote at such meeting in respect thereof.
- 77.81. Where there are joint registered holders of any <u>sS</u>hare, any one of such persons may vote at any meeting, either personally or by proxy, in respect of such <u>sS</u>hare as if he were solely entitled thereto; but if more than one of such joint holders be present at any meeting personally or by proxy, that one of the said persons so present whose name stands first on the <u>*Register</u> in respect of such <u>sS</u>hare shall alone be entitled to vote in respect thereof. Several executors or administrators of a deceased <u>sS</u>hareholder, and several trustees in bankruptcy or liquidators of a <u>sS</u>hareholder in whose name any <u>sS</u>hare stands shall for the purposes of this Article be deemed joint holders thereof.
- 78.82. A sShareholder of unsound mind or in respect of whom an order has been made by any court having jurisdiction in lunacy may vote, whether on a show of hands or on a poll, by his committee, receiver, curator bonis or other person in the nature of a committee, receiver or curator bonis appointed by that court, and any such committee, receiver, curator bonis or other person may on a poll-vote by proxy. Evidence to the satisfaction of the DirectorsBoard of the authority of the person claiming to exercise the right to vote shall be delivered to such place or one of such places (if any) as is specified in accordance with these Articles for the deposit of instruments of proxy or, if no place is specified, at the Registration Office, not later than the latest time at which an instrument of proxy must, if it is to be valid for the meeting, be delivered.
- <u>79.</u> 83. Save as expressly provided in these Articles, no person other than a <u>sS</u>hareholder duly registered and who shall have paid everything for the time being due from him payable to the Company in respect of his <u>sS</u>hares shall be entitled to be present or to vote (save as proxy <u>or authorised representative</u> for another <u>sS</u>hareholder) whether personally, by proxy or by attorney or to be reckoned in the quorum, at any general meeting.
- 80.84. (a) NoSubject to paragraph (c) of this Article, no objection shall be raised to the qualification of any person exercising or purporting to exercise a vote or the admissibility of any vote except at the meeting or adjourned meeting or postponed meeting at which the vote objected to is given or tendered, and every vote not disallowed at such meeting shall be valid for all purposes. Any such objection made in due time shall be referred to the Chairman, whose decision shall be final and conclusive.

- (b) All Shareholders have the right to (a) speak at a general meeting; and (b) vote at a general meeting except where a Shareholder is required, by the Listing Rules, to abstain from voting to approve the matter under consideration.
- (c) At all times during the Relevant Period (but not otherwise), where any Shareholder is, under the Listing Rules, required to abstain from voting on any particular resolution or restricted to voting only for or only against any particular resolution, any votes cast by or on behalf of such Shareholder (whether by way of proxy or, as the case may be, its duly authorised representative) in contravention of such requirement or restriction shall not be counted.

APPOINTMENT OF PROXY AND CORPORATE REPRESENTATIVE

- 81.85. Any sShareholder entitled to attend and vote at a meeting of the Company shall be entitled to appoint another person as his proxy to attend and vote instead of him. A sShareholder who is the holder of two2 or more sShares may appoint more than one proxy to represent him and vote on his behalf at a general meeting of the Company or at a class meeting. A proxy need not be a sShareholder of the Company. On a poll or a show of hands votes may be given either personally (or, in the case of a sShareholder being a corporation, by its duly authorised representative) or by proxy. A proxy shall be entitled to exercise the same powers on behalf of a sShareholder who is an individual and for whom he acts as proxy as such sShareholder could exercise. In addition, a proxy shall be entitled to exercise the same powers on behalf of a sShareholder which is a corporation and for which he acts as proxy as such sShareholder.
- 82.86. No appointment of a proxy shall be valid unless it names the person appointed and his appointor. The DirectorsBoard may, unless they are it is satisfied that the person purporting to act as proxy is the person named in the relevant instrument for his appointment and the validity and authenticity of the signature of his appointor, decline such person "s admission to the relevant meeting, reject his vote or demand for a poll and no sShareholder who may be affected by any exercise by the DirectorsBoard of their its power in this connection shall have any claim against the Directors or any of them nor may any such exercise by the DirectorsBoard of their its powers invalidate the proceedings of the meeting in respect of which they were exercised or any resolution passed or defeated at such meeting.
- 83.87. The instrument appointing a proxy shall be in writing under the hand of signed by the appointor or of his attorney duly authorised in writing, or if the appointor is a corporation, either under seal or under the hand of signed by an officer or attorney duly authorised.

- 84.88. (a) The Company may, at its absolute discretion, provide an electronic address for the receipt of any document or information relating to proxies for a general meeting (including any instrument of proxy or invitation to appoint a proxy, any document necessary to show the validity of, or otherwise relating to, an appointment of proxy (whether or not required under these Articles) and notice of termination of the authority of a proxy). If such an electronic address is provided, the Company shall be deemed to have agreed that any such document or information (relating to proxies as aforesaid) may be sent by electronic means to that address, subject as hereafter provided and subject to any other limitations or conditions specified by the Company when providing the address. Without limitation, the Company may from time to time determine that any such electronic address may be used generally for such matters or specifically for particular meetings or purposes and, if so, the Company may provide different electronic addresses for different purposes. The Company may also impose any conditions on the transmission of and its receipt of such electronic communications including, for the avoidance of doubt, imposing any security or encryption arrangements as may be specified by the Company. If any document or information required to be sent to the Company under this Article is sent to the Company by electronic means, such document or information is not treated as validly delivered to or deposited with the Company if the same is not received by the Company at its designated electronic address provided in accordance with this Article or if no electronic address is so designated by the Company for the receipt of such document or information.
 - (b) The instrument appointing a proxy and, if requested by the Board, the power of attorney or other authority; (if any;) under which it is signed or a notarially certified copy of that power or authority shall be deposited at such place or one of such places (if any) as ismay be specified infor that purpose in or by way of note to or in any document accompanying the notice of the meeting or in the instrument of proxy issued by the Company (or, if no place is specified, at the Registration Office), or if the Company has provided an electronic address in accordance with the preceding paragraph, shall be received at the electronic address specified, not less than forty eight 48 hours before the time appointed for holding the meeting or adjourned meeting or pollpostponed meeting (as the case may be) at which the person named in such instrument proposes to vote, and in default the instrument of proxy shall not be treated as valid. No instrument appointing a proxy shall be valid after the expiration of twelve months 12 Months from the date named in it as its date of its execution, except at an adjourned meeting or on a poll demanded at a meeting or an adjourned postponed meeting in a case where the meeting was originally held within twelve months 12 Months from such date. Delivery of an instrument appointing a proxy shall not preclude a sShareholder from attending and voting in person at the meeting or upon the poll concerned and, in such event, the instrument appointing a proxy shall be deemed to be revoked.

- 85.89. Every instrument of proxy, whether for a specified meeting or otherwise, shall be in such form as the DirectorsBoard may from time to time approve, provided that any form issued to a sShareholder for use by him for appointing a proxy to attend and vote at a specialan extraordinary general meeting or at an annual general meeting at which any business is to be transacted shall be such as to enable the sShareholder, according to his intentions, to instruct the proxy to vote in favour of or against (or, in default of instructions, to exercise his discretion in respect of) each resolution dealing with any such business. The Board may decide, either generally or in any particular case, to treat a proxy appointment as valid notwithstanding that the appointment or any of the information required under these Articles has not been received in accordance with the requirements of these Articles. Subject to aforesaid, if the proxy appointment and any of the information required under these Articles is not received in the manner set out in these Articles, the appointee shall not be entitled to vote in respect of the Shares in question.
- 86.90. The instrument appointing a proxy to vote at a general meeting shall: (i) be deemed to confer authority upon the proxy to demand or join in demanding a poll and to vote on any resolution (or amendment thereto) put to the meeting for which it is given as the proxy thinks fit; and (ii) unless the contrary is stated therein, be valid as well for any adjournment or postponement of the meeting as for the meeting to which it relates.
- 87.91. A vote given in accordance with the terms of an instrument of proxy or by the duly authorised representative of a corporation shall be valid notwithstanding the previous death or insanity of the principal or revocation of the proxy or power of attorney or other authority under which the proxy was executed or the transfer of the sShare in respect of which the proxy is given, provided that no intimation in writing of such death, insanity, revocation or transfer as aforesaid shall have been received by the Company at its Registration Office, or at such other place as is referred to in Article 884, at least two2 hours before the commencement of the meeting or adjourned meeting or postponed meeting at which the proxy is used.
- 88.92. (Aa) Any corporation which is a shareholder of the CompanyShareholder may, by resolution of its directors or other governing body or by power of attorney, authorise anysuch person as it thinks fit to act as its representative at any meeting of the Company or of any class of sShareholders of the Company, and the person so authorised shall be entitled to exercise the same rights and powers on behalf of the corporation which he represents as that corporation could exercise if it were an individual sShareholder of the Company. References in these Articles to a sShareholder present in person at a meeting shall, unless the context otherwise requires, include a corporation which is a sShareholder represented at the meeting by such duly authorised representative.

- (b)(B) Where a sShareholder is a eClearing hHouse (or its nominee(s)), it may (subject to Articles 89 and 90) authorise such person or persons as it thinks fit to act as its representative or representatives or proxies at any meeting of the Company or at any meeting of any class of sShareholders provided that if more than one person is so authorised, the authorisation-or proxy form shall specify the number and class of schares in respect of which each such representative or proxy is so authorised. Each person so authorised underpursuant to the provisions of this Article shall be deemed to have been duly authorised without further evidence of the facts and be entitled to exercise the same rights and powers on behalf of the e \underline{C} learing $\underline{h}\underline{H}$ ouse (or its nominee(s)) which he represents as that Clearing House (or its nominee(s)) could exercise as if such person was the registered holder of the shares of the CompanyShares held by the eClearing hHouse (or its nominee(s)) in respect of the number and class of sShares specified in the relevant authorisation or proxy form-including the right to speak and to vote and, where a show of hands is allowed, <u>including</u> the right to vote individually on a show of hands.
- 89.93. Unless the <u>Directors—Board</u> agrees otherwise, an appointment of a corporate representative shall not be valid as against the Company unless:-
 - (a)(A) in the case of such an appointment by a <u>sS</u>hareholder which is a <u>eC</u>learing <u>hH</u>ouse (or its nominee(s)), a written notification of the appointment issued by any director, the secretary or any authorised officer(s) of such <u>sS</u>hareholder shall have been delivered at such place or one of such places (if any) as is specified in the notice of meeting or in the form of notice issued by the Company—(, or handed to the Chairman at the meeting or, if no place is specified, at the <u>Registration Office</u>) <u>principal place of business maintained by the Company in the Relevant Territory from time to time</u> before the time of holding the meeting or adjourned meeting <u>or postponed meeting</u> at which the person so authorised proposes to vote <u>or handed to the Chairman at the meeting</u>; and
 - (b)(B) in the case of such an appointment by any other corporate sShareholder, a copy of the resolution of theits directors or other governing body of the sShareholder authorising the appointment of the corporate representative or a form of notice of appointment of corporate representative issued by the Company for such purpose or a copy of the relevant power of attorney, together with an up-to-date copy of the sShareholder's constitutive documents and a list of directors or members of the governing body of the sShareholder as at the date of such resolution, (or, as the case may be, power of attorney, in each case certified by a director, secretary or a member of the governing body of that shareholder and notarised (Shareholder, or in the case of a form of notice of appointment issued by the eCompany as aforesaid, completed and signed in accordance with the instructions thereon or in the case of a power of attorney a notaried certified copy of the relevant authority under which it was signed), shall have been deposited at such place or one of such places (if any) as is specified in the notice of meeting or in the form of

notice issued by the Company as aforesaid (or, if no place is specified, at the Registration Office) not less than <u>forty-eight48</u> hours before the time for holding the meeting or adjourned meeting or <u>pollpostponed meeting</u> (as the case may be) at which the corporate representative proposes to vote.

90.94. No appointment of a corporate representative shall be valid unless it names the person authorised to act as the appointor's representative and the appointor is also named. The DirectorsBoard may, unless they areit is satisfied that a person purporting to act as a corporate representative is the person named in the relevant instrument for his appointment, decline such person's admission to the relevant meeting and/or reject his vote or demand for a poll and no sShareholder who may be affected by any exercise by the DirectorsBoard of theirits power in this connection shall have any claim against the DirectorsBoard or any of them nor may any such exercise by the DirectorsBoard of theirits powers invalidate the proceedings of the meeting in respect of which they were exercised or any resolution passed or defeated at such meeting.

REGISTERED OFFICE

91.95. The Registered Office of the Company shall be at such place in the Cayman Islands as the Directors Board shall from time to time appoint decide.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

- <u>92.96.</u> The number of Directors shall not be <u>fewerless</u> than <u>one two (2)</u>. The Company shall keep at its Registered Office a register of its directors and officers in accordance with the Companies <u>LawAct</u>.
- 93.97. A Director may at any time, by notice in writing signed by him delivered to the Registered Office or at the Head Office or at a meeting of the DirectorsBoard, appoint any person (including another Director) to act as alternate Director in his place during his absence and may in like manner at any time determine such appointment. If such person is not another Director such appointment unless previously approved by the DirectorsBoard shall have effect only upon and subject to being so approved. The appointment of an alternate Director shall determine on the happening of any event which, were he a Director, would cause him to vacate such office or if his appointor ceases to be a Director. An alternate Director may act as alternate to more than one Director.

- 94.98. (Aa) An alternate Director shall (subject to his giving to the Company an address, telephone and facsimile number within the territory of the Head Office for the time being for the giving of notices on him and except when absent from the territory in which the Head Office is for the time being situate) be entitled (in addition to his appointor) to receive and (in lieu of his appointor) to waive notices of meetings of the Directors Board and of any committee of the Directors Board of which his appointor is a member and shall be entitled to attend and vote as a Director at any such meeting at which the Director appointing him is not personally present and generally at such meeting to perform all the functions of his appointor as a Director and for the purposes of the proceedings at such meeting the provisions of these presents Articles shall apply as if he (instead of his appointor) were a Director. If he shall be himself a Director or shall attend any such meeting as an alternate for more than one Director his voting rights shall be cumulative. If his appointor is for the time being absent from the territory in which the Head Office is for the time being situate or otherwise not available or unable to act, his signature to any resolution in writing of the Directors or any such committee shall be as effective as the signature of his appointor. His attestation of the affixing of the Seal shall be as effective as the signature and attestation of his appointor. An alternate Director shall not, save as aforesaid, have power to act as a Director nor shall he be deemed to be a Director for the purposes of these Articles.
 - (b)(B) An alternate Director shall be entitled to contract and be interested in and benefit from contracts or arrangements or transactions and to be repaid expenses and to be indemnified to the same extent mutatis mutandis as if he were a Director, but he shall not be entitled to receive from the Company in respect of his appointment as alternate Director any remuneration except only such part (if any) of the ordinary remuneration otherwise payable to his appointor as such appointor may by notice in writing to the Company from time to time direct.
 - (c)(C) A certificate by a Director (including for the purpose of this paragraph (Cc) an alternate Director) or the Secretary that a Director (who may be the one signing the certificate) was at the time of a resolution of the Directors or any committee thereof absent from the territory of the Head Office or otherwise not available or unable to act or has not supplied an address, telephone and facsimile number within the territory of the Head Office for the purposes of giving of notice to him shall in favour of all persons without express notice to the contrary, be conclusive of the matter so certified.
- 95.99. A Director or an alternate Director shall not be required to hold any qualification sShares but shall nevertheless be entitled to attend and speak at all general meetings of the Company and all meetings of any class of sShareholders of the Company.

- 96.100. The Directors shall be entitled to receive by way of ordinary remuneration for their services as Directors such sum as shall from time to time be determined by the Company in general meeting, such sum (unless otherwise directed by the resolution by which it is voted) to be divided amongst the Directors in such proportions and in such manner as they may agree, or failing agreement, equally, except that in such event any Director holding office for less than the whole of the relevant period in respect of which the ordinary remuneration is paid shall only rank in such division in proportion to the time during such period for which he has held office. The foregoing provisionsSuch remuneration shall not apply tobe in addition to any other remuneration to which a Director who holds any salaried employment or office in the Company except in the case of sums paid or payable in respect of Directors' feesmay be entitled by reason of such employment or office.
- 97.101. The Directors shall also be entitled to be repaid all travelling, hotel and other expenses reasonably incurred by them respectively in or about the performance of their duties as Directors, including their expenses of travelling to and from Directors/Board meetings, committee meetings or general meetings or otherwise incurred whilst engaged on the business of the Company or in the discharge of their duties as Directors.
- 98.102. The Directors Board may grant special remuneration to any Director who shall perform or has performed any special or extra services to or at the request of the Company. Such special remuneration may be made payable to such Director in addition to or in substitution for his ordinary remuneration as a Director, and may be made payable by way of salary, commission or participation in profits or otherwise as may be arranged.
- 99.103. Notwithstanding Articles 10096, 10197 and 10298, the remuneration of a Managing Director, Joint Managing Director, Deputy Managing Director or an Executive Director or a Director appointed to any other office in the management of the Company may from time to time be fixed by the Directors Board and may be by way of salary, commission, or participation in profits or otherwise or by all or any of those modes and with such other benefits (including pension and/or gratuity and/or other benefits on retirement) and allowances as the Directors Board may from time to time decide. Such remuneration shall be in addition to his ordinary remuneration as a Directors.
- 100.101. (Aa) Payments to any Director or past Director of the Company of any sum by way of compensation for loss of office or as consideration for or in connection with his retirement from office (not being a payment to which the Director of the Company or past Dairector is contractually or statutorily entitled) must be approved by the Company in general meeting.
 - (b)(B) Except with the approval of, or ratified by, the The Company in general meeting, the Company mayshall not make any loans to, or provide any guarantee, indemnity or security in respect of any loan, directly or indirectly,

to a Director or any of his associates, provided that this Article does not prohibit the granting of any loan or the provision of any guarantee, indemnity or security:

- (i) to be applied for, or is in respect of a liability incurred for, any business of the Company;
- (ii) for the purchase by a Director (or the repayment of a loan for his purchase) of a residence where the amount of the loan, the liability under the guarantee or indemnity or the value of the security does not exceed 80 per cent. of the fair market value of such residence nor 5 per cent. of the consolidated net asset value of the Company as shown in its latest audited accounts; provided that any such loan is on normal commercial terms and is secured by a legal charge over the residence; or
- (iii) of any amount to, or in respect of a liability of, a company in which the Company has an equity interest, and the amount of such loan, or the liability assumed by the Company under such guarantee, indemnity or security, does not exceed its proportional interest in such company.
- (C) the prohibitions prescribed by paragraphs a body corporate controlled by a Director or his close associates if and to the extent it would be prohibited by the Companies Ordinance (Chapter 622 of the laws of Hong Kong) if the Company were a company incorporated in Hong Kong.
- (c) Article 100(Aa) and (Bb) of this Article shall only apply during the Relevant Period.

101. 105. A Director shall vacate his office:

- (a) (i) if he becomes bankrupt or has a receiving order made against him or suspends payment or compounds with his creditors generally; or
 - (ii) if he becomes a lunatic or of unsound mind;
- (b) if he dies or becomes of unsound mind as determined pursuant to an order made by any competent court or official on the grounds that he is or may be suffering from mental disorder or is otherwise incapable of managing his affairs and the Board resolves that his office be vacated; or

- (c)(iii) if he absents himself from the meetings of the DirectorsBoard during a continuous period of six-6 mMonths, without special leave of absence from the DirectorsBoard, and his alternate Director (if any) shall not during such period have attended in his stead, and the DirectorsBoard pass a resolution that he has by reason of such absence vacated his office; or
- (d)(iv) if he becomes prohibited by law from acting as a Director, or he ceases to be a Director by virtue of any provision of law or is removed from office pursuant to these Articles; or
- (e)(v) if he has been validly required by the stock exchange of the Relevant Territory to cease to be a Director and the relevant time period for application for review of or appeal against such requirement has lapsed and no application for review or appeal has been filed or is underway against such requirement; or
- (f)(vi) if by notice in writing delivered to the Company at its Registered Office or at the Head Office or tendered at a meeting of the Board he resigns his office; or
- (g)(vii) if he shall be removed from office by a Special an Ordinary Resolution of the Company under Article 1140; or
- (h) if he shall be removed from the office by notice in writing served on him signed by not less than three-fourths in number (or if that is not a round number, the nearest lower round number) of the Directors (including himself) then in office.
- <u>102.106.</u> No Director shall be required to vacate office or be ineligible for re-election or reappointment as a Director, and no person shall be ineligible for appointment as a Director by reason only of his having attained any particular age.
- 103.107. (Aa)A Director may hold any other office or place of profit with the Company (except that of Auditors) in conjunction with his office of Director for such period and upon such terms as the DirectorsBoard may determine, and may be paid such extra remuneration therefor (whether by way of salary, commission, participation in profits or otherwise) as the DirectorsBoard may determine, and such extra remuneration shall be in addition to any remuneration provided for, by or pursuant to any other Article.
 - (b)(B) A Director may act by himself or his firm in a professional capacity for the Company (otherwise than as Auditors) and he or his firm shall be entitled to remuneration for professional services as if he were not a Director.
 - (c)(C) A Director may be or become a director or other officer of, or otherwise interested in, any company promoted by the Company or any other company in which the Company may be interested, and shall not be liable to account to the Company or the <u>sS</u>hareholders for any remuneration, profit or other

benefit received by him as a director or officer of or from his interest in such other company. The Directors may also cause the voting power conferred by the shares in any other company held or owned by the Company to be exercised in such manner in all respects as they think fit, including the exercise thereof in favour of any resolution appointing the Directors or any of them to be directors or officers of such other company, or voting or providing for the payment of remuneration to the directors or officers of such other company.

- (d)(D) A Director shall not vote or be counted in the quorum on any resolution of the Directors concerning his own appointment or the appointment of any of his close associate(s) as the holder of any office or place of profit with the Company or any other company in which the Company is interested (including the arrangement or variation of the terms thereof, or the termination thereof).
- (e)(E) Where arrangements are under consideration concerning the appointment (including the arrangement, remuneration or variation of the terms thereof, or the termination thereof) of two2 or more Directors or any of the close associate(s) of any such Director(s) to offices or places of profit with the Company or any other company in which the Company is interested, a separate resolution may be put in relation to each Director or, as the case may be, the close associate(s) of such Director and in such case each of the Directors concerned shall be entitled to vote (and be counted in the quorum) in respect of each resolution except that concerning his own appointment or the appointment of any of his close associate(s) (or the arrangement or variation of the terms thereof, or the termination thereof) and (in the case of an office or place of profit with any such other company as aforesaid) where the other company is a company in which the Director together with any of and his associates close associate(s) in aggregate own 5 per cent. or more of the issued sShares of any class of the voting equity share capital of such company or of the voting rights of any class of sShares of such company (other than sShares which carry no voting rights at general meetings and no or nugatory dividend and return of capital rights).

- (f)(F) Subject to the next paragraph of this Article, no Director or proposed or intended Director shall be disqualified by his office from contracting with the Company, either with regard to his tenure of any office or place of profit or as vendor, purchaser or in any other manner whatever, nor shall any contract with regard thereto or any other contract or arrangement in which any Director is in any way interested be liable to be avoided, nor shall any Director so contracting or being so interested be liable to account to the Company or the sShareholders for any remuneration, profit or other benefits realised by any such contract or arrangement, by reason only of such Director holding that office or the fiduciary relationship thereby established.
- (g)(G) A Director wholf to his the knowledge of a Director, he or any of his close associates, is in any way, whether directly or indirectly, interested in a contract or arrangement or proposed contract or arrangement with the Company, he shall declare the nature of his or, as the case may be, his close <u>associate(s)'</u> interest at the meeting of the Directors at which the question of entering into the contract or arrangement is first taken into consideration, if he knows his interest or that of his close associate(s) then exists, or in any other case at the first meeting of the Directors after he knows that he or his close associate(s) is or has become so interested. For the purposes of this Article, a general notice to the Directors by a Director to the effect that (a) he or his close associate(s) is a shareholder of a specified company or firm and is to be regarded as interested in any contract or arrangement which may after the date of the notice be made with that company or firm or (b) he or his close associate(s) is to be regarded as interested in any contract or arrangement which may after the date of the notice be made with a specified person who is connected with him or any of his close associate(s), shall be deemed to be a sufficient declaration of interest under this Article in relation to any such contract or arrangement; provided that no such notice shall be effective unless either it is given at a meeting of the Directors or the Director takes reasonable steps to secure that it is brought up and read at the next meeting of the Directors after it is given.
- (h)(H) A Director shall not vote (nor be counted in the quorum) on any resolution of the Directors approving any contract or arrangement or any other proposal in which he or any of-his associates close associate(s) is materially interested, but this prohibition shall not apply to any of the following matters namely:
 - (i) any contract or arrangement for the giving of any security or indemnity either:-
 - (A) to such the Director or his close associate(s) any security or indemnity in respect of money lent by him or any of his associate(s) or obligationsobligation incurred or undertaken by him or any of his associate(s) them at the request of or for the benefit of the Company or any of its subsidiaries;

- (ii) any contract or arrangement for the giving of any security or indemnity or
 - (B) to a third party in respect of a debt or obligation of the Company or any of its subsidiaries for which the Director or his <u>close</u> associate(s) has himself/themselves assumed responsibility in whole or in part <u>and</u> whether alone or jointly under a guarantee or indemnity or by the giving of security;
- (ii)(iii) any contract or arrangementproposal concerning an offer of sShares or debentures or other securities of or by the Company or any other company which the Company may promote or be interested in for subscription or purchase, where the Director or his close associate(s) is/are or is/are to be interested as a participant in the underwriting or sub -underwriting of the offer;
- (iv) any contract or arrangement in which the Director or his associate(s) is/are interested in the same manner as other holders of shares or debentures or other securities of the Company by virtue only of his/their interest in shares or debentures or other securities of the Company; or
- (iii)(v) any proposal or arrangement concerning the <u>benefit of employees of the Company or its subsidiaries including:</u>
 - (A) the adoption, modification or operation of any employees' share scheme or any share incentive or share option scheme, under which the Director or his close associate(s) may benefit; or
 - (B) the adoption, modification or operation of a pension fund or retirement, death or disability benefits scheme or other arrangement—which relates both—to Directors or the Director, his close associate(s) and to employeesemployee(s) of the Company or of any of its subsidiaries and does not provide in respect of any Director, or his close associate(s), as such any privilege or advantage not accorded generally accorded to the class of persons to which such scheme or fund relates;
- (iv) any contract or arrangement in which the Director or his close associate(s) is/are interested in the same manner as other holders of Shares or debentures or other securities of the Company by virtue only of his/their interest in Shares or debentures or other securities of the Company.
- (I) Intentionally deleted
- (J) Intentionally deleted

- (i)(K) If any question shall arise at any meeting of the Directors Board as to the materiality of the interest of a Director or any of his close associate(s) (other than the Chairman) or as to the entitlement of any Director (other than such Chairman) to vote or be counted in the quorum and such question is not resolved by his voluntarily agreeing to abstain from voting or not to be counted in the quorum, such question (unless it relates to the Chairman) shall be referred to the Chairman and his ruling in relation to such other Director shall be final and conclusive except in a case where the nature or extent of the interest of the Director concerned or his close associate(s) as known to such Director has not been fairly disclosed to the other Directors Board. If any question as aforesaid shall arise in respect of the Chairman such question shall be decided by a resolution of the Directors Board (for which purpose the such Chairman shall not be counted in the quorum and shall not vote thereon) and such resolution shall be final and conclusive except in a case where the nature or extent of the interest of the such Chairman or his close associate(s) as known to him has not been fairly disclosed to the other Directors Board.
- (j)(L) The provisions of paragraphs (Dd), (Ee), (Hh), and (Ki) of this Article 1073 shall apply during the Relevant Period but not otherwise. In respect of all periods other than the Relevant Period, a Director may vote in respect of any contract, arrangement or transaction or proposed contract, arrangement or transaction notwithstanding that he or any of his close associate(s) is or may be interested therein and, if he does so, his vote shall be counted and he may be counted in the quorum at any meeting of the Directors at which any such contract, arrangement or transaction or proposed contract, arrangement or transaction shall come before the meeting for consideration provided that he has, where relevant, first disclosed his interest in accordance with paragraph (Cg).
- (k)(M) The Company may by Ordinary Resolution suspend or relax the provisions of this Article to any extent or ratify any transaction not duly authorised by reason of a contravention of this Article.

APPOINTMENT AND ROTATION OF DIRECTORS

- 104.108. (Aa) AtNotwithstanding any other provisions in these Articles, at each annual general meeting one-third of the Directors for the time being, or, if their number is not three3 or a multiple of three3, then the number nearest to but not exceedingless than one-third, shall retire from office by rotation provided that noevery Director holding office as Chairman or Deputy Chairman under Article 132 or the office of Managing Director or Joint Managing Director under Article 122(including those appointed for a specific term) shall be subject to retirement by rotation or be taken into account in determining the number of Directors to retireat least once every 3 years. A retiring Director shall be eligible for re-election and shall continue to act as a Director throughout the meeting at which he retires. The Company at the general meeting at which a Director retires may fill the vacated office.
 - (b)(B) The Directors to retire by rotation shall include (so far as necessary to obtain the number required) any Director who wishes to retire and not to offer himself for re-election. Any further Directors so to retire shall be those who have been longest in office since their last re-election or appointment and so that as between persons who became or were last re-elected Directors on the same day those to retire shall (unless they otherwise agree among themselves) be determined by lot.
 - (c)(C) A Director is not required to retire upon reaching any particular age.
- 105.109. If at any general meeting at which an election of Directors ought to take place, the places of the retiring Directors are not filled, the retiring Directors or such of them as have not had their places filled shall be deemed to have been re-elected and shall, if willing, continue in office until the next annual general meeting and so on from year to year until their places are filled, unless:
 - (a)(i) it shall be determined at such meeting to reduce the number of Directors; or
 - (b)(iii) it is expressly resolved at such meeting not to fill such vacated offices; or
 - (c)(iii) in any such case the resolution for re-election of a Director is put to the meeting and lost; or
 - (d)(iv) such Director has given notice in writing to the Company that he is not willing to be re-elected.
- <u>106.110.</u> The Company in general meeting <u>shallmay</u> from time to time fix and may from time to time by Ordinary Resolution increase or reduce the maximum and minimum number of Directors but so that the number of Directors shall not be <u>fewerless</u> than <u>onetwo (2)</u>.

- 107.111. The Company may from time to time in general meeting by Ordinary Resolution elect any person to be a Director either to fill a casual vacancy or as an additional Director. Any Director so appointed shall hold office only until the next following annual general meeting of the Company and shall then be eligible for re election at the meeting but shall not be taken into account in determining the Directors or the number of Directors who arebe subject to retirement by rotation at such meeting pursuant to Article 104.
- <u>108.112.</u> The <u>DirectorsBoard</u> shall have power from time to time and at any time to appoint any person as a Director either to fill a casual vacancy or as an additional Director [but so that the number of Directors so appointed shall not exceed the maximum number determined from time to time by the <u>sS</u>hareholders in general meeting]. Any Director so appointed shall hold office only until the <u>next followingfirst</u> annual general meeting of the Company <u>after his appointment</u> and shall then be eligible for re-election at the meeting but shall not be taken into account in determining the Directors or the number of Directors who are to retire by rotation at such meeting.
- 109.113. No person, other than a retiring Director, shall, unless recommended by the DirectorsBoard for election, be eligible for election to the office of Director at any general meeting, unless a notice in writingsigned by a Shareholder (other than the person to be proposed) duly qualified to attend and vote at the meeting for which such notice is given of thehis intention to propose thatsuch person for election as a Director and also a notice in writingsigned by thate person to be proposed of his willingness to be elected shall have been lodged at the Head Office or at the Registration Office but no morefor at least seven (7) days commencing no earlier than the day immediately after the despatch of the notice of the general meeting and ending no later than seven elear(7) days before the date of thesuch general meeting.
- 110.114. The Company may by SpecialOrdinary Resolution remove any Director (including a Managing Director or other Executive Director) before the expiration of his periodterm of office notwithstanding anything in these Articles or in any agreement between the Company and such Director (but without prejudice to any claim which such Director may have for damages for any breach of any contract between him and the Company) and may by Ordinary Resolution elect another person in his stead. Any person so elected shall hold office only until the next following irst annual general meeting of the Company after his appointment and shall then be eligible for re-election, but shall not be taken into account in determining the Directors or the number of Directors who are to retire by rotation at such meeting.

BORROWING POWERS

- <u>III.415.</u> The <u>DirectorsBoard</u> may from time to time at <u>theirits</u> discretion exercise all the powers of the Company to raise or borrow or to secure the payment of any sum or sums of money for the purposes of the Company and to mortgage or charge its undertaking, property and uncalled capital or any part thereof.
- <u>II2.116.</u> The <u>DirectorsBoard</u> may raise or secure the payment or repayment of such sum or sums in such manner and upon such terms and conditions in all respects as <u>they-it</u> thinks fit and in particular but subject to the provisions of the Companies <u>LawAct</u>, by the issue of debentures, debenture stock, bonds or other securities of the Company, whether outright or as collateral security for any debt, liability or obligation of the Company or of any third party.
- 113.117. Debentures, debenture stock, bonds and other securities (other than <u>sS</u>hares which are not fully paid) may be made assignable free from any equities between the Company and the person to whom the same may be issued.
- 114.118. Any debentures, debenture stock, bonds or other securities (other than sShares) may be issued at a discount, premium or otherwise and with any special privileges as to redemption, surrender, drawings, allotment or subscription of or conversion into sShares, attending and voting at general meetings of the Company, appointment of Directors and otherwise.
- 115.119. The Directors shall cause a proper register to be kept, in accordance with the provisions of the Companies LawAct, of all mortgages and charges specifically affecting the property of the Company and shall duly comply with such provisions of the Companies LawAct with regard to the registration of mortgages and charges as may be specified or required.
- <u>116. 120.</u> If the Company issues a series of debentures or debenture stock not transferable by delivery, the <u>DirectorsBoard</u> shall cause a proper register to be kept of the holders of such debentures.
- <u>117.121.</u> Where any uncalled capital of the Company is charged, all persons taking any subsequent charge thereon shall take the same subject to such prior charge, and shall not be entitled, by notice to the <u>sS</u>hareholders or otherwise, to obtain priority over such prior charge.

MANAGING DIRECTORS, ETC.

- <u>II8.122.</u> The <u>DirectorsBoard</u> may from time to time appoint any one or more of them to the office of Managing Director, Joint Managing Director, Deputy Managing Director or other Executive Director and/or such other office in the management of the business of the Company as <u>they it</u> may decide for such period and upon such terms as <u>they it</u> thinks fit and upon such terms as to remuneration as <u>they it</u> may decide in accordance with Article <u>103</u>99.
- 119.123. Every Director appointed to an office under Article 12218 hereof shall, but without prejudice to any claim for damages for breach of any contract of service between himself and the Company, be liable to be dismissed or removed therefrom by the Directors Board.
- 120.124. A Director appointed to an office under Article 122 shall not be subject to the same provisions as to rotation but 18 shall be subject to the same provisions as to resignation and removal as the other Directors of the Company, and he shall ipso facto and immediately cease to hold such office if he shall cease to hold the office of Director for any cause.
- 121.125. The Directors Board may from time to time entrust to and confer upon a Chairman, Deputy Chairman, Vice Chairman, Managing Director, Joint Managing Director, Deputy Managing Director or Executive Director all or any of the powers of the Directors Board that they it may think fit provided that the exercise of all powers by such Director shall be subject to such regulations and restrictions as the Directors Board may from time to time make and impose, and, subject to the terms thereof, the said powers may at any time be withdrawn, revoked or varied, but no person dealing in good faith and without notice of such withdrawal, revocation or variation shall be affected thereby.
- 122.126. The DirectorsBoard may from time to time appoint any person to an office or employment having a designation or title including the word ""Ddirector" or attach to any existing office or employment with the Company such a designation or title. The inclusion of the word ""Ddirector" in the designation or title of any office or employment with the Company (other than the office of Managing Director or Joint Managing Director or Deputy Managing Director or Executive Director) shall not imply that the holder thereof is a Director nor shall such holder be empowered in any respect to act as a Director or be deemed to be a Director for any of the purposes of these Articles.

MANAGEMENT

- 123.127. The management of the business of the Company shall be vested inmanaged by the DirectorsBoard who, in addition to the powers and authorities by these Articles expressly conferred upon themit, may exercise all such powers and do all such acts and things as may be exercised or done or approved by the Company and are not hereby or by the StatutesCompanies Act expressly directed or required to be exercised or done by the Company in general meeting, but subject nevertheless to the provisions of the StatutesCompanies Act and of these Articles and to any regulations from time to time made by the Company in general meeting not being inconsistent with such provisions or these Articles, provided that no regulation so made shall invalidate any prior act of the DirectorsBoard which would have been valid if such regulation had not been made.
- <u>124. 128.</u> Without prejudice to the general powers conferred by these Articles, it is hereby expressly declared that the <u>DirectorsBoard</u> shall have the following powers:
 - (a) to give to any person the right or option of requiring at a future date that an allotment shall be made to him of any <u>sS</u>hare at par or at such premium and on such other terms as may be agreed; and
 - (b) to give to any Directors, officers or employees of the Company an interest in any particular business or transaction or participation in the profits thereof or in the general profits of the Company either in addition to or in substitution for a salary or other remuneration.

MANAGERS

- 125.129. The Directors Board may from time to time appoint a general manager, manager or managers of the business of the Company arind may fix his or their remuneration either by way of salary or commission or by conferring the right to participation in the profits of the Company or by a combination of two2 or more of these modes and pay the working expenses of any of the staff of the general manager, manager or managers who may be employed by him or them upon the business of the Company.
- <u>126.139.</u> The appointment of such general manager, manager or managers may be for such period as the <u>DirectorsBoard</u> may decide and the <u>DirectorsBoard</u> may confer upon him or them all or any of the powers of the <u>DirectorsBoard</u> and such title or titles as <u>theyit</u> may think fit.
- 127.131. The DirectorsBoard may enter into such agreement or agreements with any such general manager, manager or managers upon such terms and conditions in all respects as theyit may in theirits absolute discretion think fit, including a power for such general manager, manager or managers to appoint an assistant manager or managers or other employees whatsoever under them for the purpose of carrying on the business of the Company.

CHAIRMAN AND OTHER OFFICERS

128.132. The DirectorsBoard may from time to time elect or otherwise appoint one or more of them to the office of Chairman of the Company and another to be the Deputy or Vice Chairman (or two2 or more Deputy or Vice Chairmaen) and determine the period for which each of them is to hold office. The Chairman or, in his absence, the Deputy or Vice Chairman shall preside as chairman at meetings of the DirectorsBoard, but if no such Chairman or Deputy or Vice Chairman be elected or appointed, or if at any meeting the Chairman or Deputy or Vice Chairman is not present within five5 minutes after the time appointed for holding the same and willing to act, the Directors present shall choose one of their number to be chairman of such meeting. All the provisions of Articles 99, 1034, 119, 123, 1240 and 1251 shall mutatis mutandis apply to any Directors elected or otherwise appointed to any office in accordance with the provisions of this Article.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE DIRECTORS

- 129.133. The DirectorsBoard may meet together for the despatch of business, adjourn, postpone and otherwise regulate theirits meetings and proceedings as they it thinks fit and may determine the quorum necessary for the transaction of business. Unless otherwise determined two2 Directors shall be a quorum. For the purpose of this Article an alternate Director shall be counted in a quorum separately in respect of himself (if a Director) and in respect of each Director for whom he is an alternate and his voting rights shall be cumulative and he need not use all his votes or cast all his votes in the same way. A meeting of the DirectorsBoard or any committee of the DirectorsBoard may be held by means of such telephone, electronic or other communication facilities as permit all persons participating in the meeting to communicate with each other simultaneously and instantaneously, and participation in such a meeting shall constitute presence in person at such meeting. Notwithstanding any common law rule to the contrary, a meeting of the Directors may be constituted by one Director.
- 130.134. A Director may, and on the request of a Director the Secretary shall, at any time summon a meeting of the Directors Board which may be held in any part of the world-provided that at least one Directors' meeting shall be held in the Cayman Islands in each calendar year, but subject thereto, no such meeting shall be summoned to be held outside the territory in which the Head Office is for the time being situate without the prior approval of the Directors Board. Notice thereof shall be given to each Director and alternate Director in person orally or in writing or by telephone or by telex or telegram or facsimile transmission at the telephone or facsimile number or address (including an electronic address) from time to time notified to the Company by such Director or in such other manner as the Directors Board may from time to time determine. A Director absent or intending to be absent from the territory in which the Head Office is for the time being situate may request the Directors Board or the Secretary that notices of Directors' Board meetings shall during his absence be sent in writing to him at his last known address, facsimile or telex number or any other address, facsimile or telex number given by him to the Company for this purpose, but such notices need not be given

- any earlier than notices given to <u>the other Directors</u> not so absent and in the absence of any such request it shall not be necessary to give notice of a <u>Directors'Board</u> meeting to any Director who is for the time being absent from such territory.
- 131.135. Questions Subject to Article 103, questions arising at any meeting of the Directors Board shall be decided by a majority of votes, and in case of an equality of votes the eChairman of the meeting shall have a second or casting vote.
- 132.136. A meeting of the Directors Board for the time being at which a quorum is present shall be competent to exercise all or any of the authorities, powers and discretions by or under these Articles for the time being vested in or exercisable by the Directors Board generally.
- 133.137. The Directors Board may delegate any of their its powers to committees consisting of such member(s) of them and such other person(s) as they it thinks fit, and they it may from time to time revoke such delegation or revoke the appointment of and discharge any such committees either wholly or in part, and either as to persons or purposes, but every committee so formed shall in the exercise of the powers so delegated conform to any regulations that may from time to time be imposed upon it by the Directors Board.
- 134. 138. All acts done by any such committee in conformity with such regulations and in fulfilment of the purposes for which it is appointed, but not otherwise, shall have the like force and effect as if done by the DirectorsBoard, and the DirectorsBoard, and the DirectorsBoard, shall have power, with the consent of the Company in general meeting, to remunerate the members of any special committee, and charge such remuneration to the current expenses of the Company.
- 135.139. The meetings and proceedings of any such committee consisting of two2 or more members shall be governed by the provisions herein contained for regulating the meetings and proceedings of the DirectorsBoard so far as the same are applicable thereto and are not replaced by any regulations imposed by the DirectorsBoard pursuant to Article 1373.
- 136.140. All acts bona fide done by any meeting of the DirectorsBoard or by any such committee or by any person acting as a Director shall, notwithstanding that it shall be afterwards discovered that there was some defect in the appointment of such Director or persons acting as aforesaid or that they or any of them were disqualified, be as valid as if every such person had been duŧly appointed and was qualified to be a Director or member of such committee.

- 137.141. The continuing Directors may act notwithstanding any vacancy in their body, but, if and so long as their number is reduced below the number fixed by or pursuant to these Articles as the necessary quorum of Directors the Board meeting, the continuing Director or Directors may act for the purpose of increasing the number of Directors to that number of the necessary quorum or of summoning a general meeting of the Company but for no other purpose.
- 138.142. (Aa) A resolution in writing signed by all the Directors (or their respective alternate Directors) shall be as valid and effectual as if it had been passed at a meeting of the DirectorsBoard duly convened and held. Any such resolutions in writing may consist of several documents in like form each signed by one or more of the Directors or alternate Directors. A notification of consent to such resolution given by a Director in writing to the Board by any means (including by means of electronic communication) shall be deemed to be his/her signature to such resolution in writing for the purpose of this Article.
 - (b) (B) Where a Director is, on the date on which a resolution in writing is last signed by a Director, absent from the territory in which the Head Office is for the time being situated, or cannot be contacted at his last known address or contact telephone or facsimile number, or itis temporarily unable to act through ill-health or disability and, in each case, his alternate (if any) is affected by any of these events, the signature of such Director (or his alternate) to the resolution shall not be required, and the resolution in writing, so long as such a resolution shall have been signed by at least two2 Directors or their respective alternates who are entitled to vote thereon or such number of Directors as shall form a quorum, shall be deemed to have been passed at a meeting of Directorsthe Board duly convened and held, provided that a copy of such resolution has been given or the contents thereof communicated to all the Directors (or their respective alternates) for the time being entitled to receive notices of meetings of the Directors Board at their respective last known address, telephone or facsimile number or, if none, at the Head Office and provided further that no Director is aware of or has received from any Director any objection to the resolution. Notwithstanding the foregoing, a resolution in writing shall not be passed in lieu of a meeting of the Directors Board for the purposes of considering any matter or business in which a substantial shareholder of the Company or a Director has a conflict of interest and the Directors-Board haves determined that such conflict of interest to be material.

(c) (C) A certificate signed by a Director (who may be one of the signatories to the relevant resolution in writing) or the Secretary as to any of the matters referred to in paragraph (Aa) or (Bb) of this Article shall in the absence of express notice to the contrary of the person relying thereon, be conclusive of the matters stated on such certificate.

MINUTES AND CORPORATE RECORDS

139.143. (Aa) The Directors Board shall cause minutes to be made of:

- (i) all appointments of officers made by themit;
- (ii) the names of the Directors present at each meeting of the <u>DirectorsBoard</u> and the names of the members present at each meeting of managers and committees appointed pursuant to Articles 1295 and 1373; and
- (iii) all resolutions and proceedings at all meetings of the Company and of the DirectorsBoard and of such managers and committees.
- (b) (B) Any such minutes shall be conclusive evidence of any such proceedings if they purport to be signed by the eChairman of the meeting at which the proceedings were held or by the eChairman of the next succeeding meeting.
- (C) The Directors shall duly comply with the provisions of the Companies Law in regard to keeping a register of shareholders and to the production and furnishing of copies of or extracts from such register.
- (D) Any register, index, minute book, book of account or other book required by these presents or the Statutes to be kept by or on behalf of the Company may be kept in writing on one or more sheets in bound or unbound books.

SECRETARY

140.144. The Secretary shall be appointed by the DirectorsBoard for such term, at such remuneration and upon such conditions as they it may think fit, and any Secretary so appointed may, without prejudice to his right under any contract with the Company, be removed by the DirectorsBoard. Anything by the StatutesCompanies Act or these Articles required or authorised to be done by or to the Secretary, if the office is vacant or there is for any other reason no Secretary capable of acting, may be done by or to any assistant or deputy Secretary, or if there is no assistant or deputy Secretary capable of acting, by or to any officer of the Company authorised generally or specifically on behalf of the DirectorsBoard. If the Secretary appointed is a corporation or other body, it may act and sign by the hand of any one or more of its directors or officers duly authorised.

- 141.145. The Secretary shall attend all meetings of the <u>sS</u>hareholders and shall keep correct minutes of such meetings and enter the same in the proper books provided for the purpose. He shall perform such other duties as are prescribed by the Companies <u>LawAct</u> and these Articles, together with such other duties as may from time to time be prescribed by the <u>DirectorsBoard</u>.
- <u>142.146.</u> A provision of the <u>StatutesCompanies Act</u> or of these Articles requiring or authorising a thing to be done by or to a Director and the Secretary shall not be satisfied by its being done by or to the same person acting both as Director and as, or in place of, the Secretary.

GENERAL MANAGEMENT AND USE OF THE SEAL

- 143.147. (Aa) Subject to the StatutesCompanies Act, the Company shall have one or more Seals as the DirectorsBoard may determine, and may have a Seal for use outside the Cayman Islands. The DirectorsBoard shall provide for the safe custody of each Seal, and no Seal shall be used without the authority of the DirectorsBoard or a committee authorised by the DirectorsBoard in that behalf.
 - (b)(B) Every instrument to which a Seal shall be affixed shall be signed autographically by one Director and the Secretary, or by two2 Directors, or by some otherany person(s or persons (including a Director and/or the Secretary) appointed by the DirectorsBoard for the purpose, provided that as regards any certificates for sShares or dDebentures or other securities of the Company, the DirectorsBoard may by resolution determine that such signatures or either of them shall be dispensed with or affixed by some method or system of mechanical signature other than autographic or may be printed thereon as specified in such resolution.
 - (C) Where the Company has a Seal for use abroad, the Board may by writing under the Seal appoint any agent or committee abroad to be the duly authorised agent of the Company thereof as may be thought fit. Wherever in these Articles reference is made to the Seal, the reference shall, when and so far as may be applicable, be deemed to include any such other Seal as aforesaid or that such certificates need not be signed by any person.

- 144. 148. All cheques, promissory notes, drafts, bills of exchange and other negotiable instruments, and all receipts for moneys paid to the Company shall be signed, drawn, accepted, iendorsed or otherwise executed, as the case may be, in such manner as the DirectorsBoard shall from time to time by resolution determine. The Company's banking accounts shall be kept with such banker or bankers as the DirectorsBoard shall from time to time determine.
- 145.149. (Aa) The DirectorsBoard may from time to time and at any time, by power of attorney under the Seal, appoint any company, firm or person or any fluctuating body of persons, whether nominated directly or indirectly by the DirectorsBoard, to be the attorney or attorneys of the Company for such purposes and with such powers, authorities and discretions (not exceeding those vested in or exercisable by the DirectorsBoard under these Articles) and for such period and subject to such conditions as theyit may think fit, and any such power of attorney may contain such provisions for the protection and convenience of persons dealing with any such attorney as the DirectorsBoard may think fit, and may also authorise any such attorney to sub-delegate all or any of the powers, authorities and discretions vested in him.
 - (b)(B) The Company may, by writing under its Seal, empower any person, either generally or in respect of any specified matter, as its attorney to execute deeds and instruments on its behalf and to enter into contracts and sign the same on its behalf and every deed signed by such attorney on behalf of the Company and under his seal shall bind the Company and have the same effect as if it were under the Seal duly affixed by the Company.
- 146.150. The DirectorsBoard may establish any committees, regional or local boards or agencies for managing any of the affairs of the Company, either in the Relevant Territory or elsewhere, and may appoint any persons to be members of such committees, regional or local boards or agencies and may fix their remuneration, and may delegate to any committee, regional or local board or agent any of the powers, authorities and discretions vested in the DirectorsBoard (other than its powers to make calls and forfeit sShares), with power to sub-delegate, and may authorise the members of any regional or local board or any of them to fill any vacancies therein and to act notwithstanding vacancies, and any such appointment or delegation may be upon such terms and subject to such conditions as the DirectorsBoard may think fit, and the DirectorsBoard may remove any person so appointed and may annul or vary any such delegation, but no person dealing in good faith and without notice of any such annulment or variation shall be affected thereby.

147. 151. The Directors Board may establish and maintain or procure the establishment and maintenance of any contributory or non-contributory pension or superannuation funds or personal pension plans for the benefit of, or give or procure the giving of donations, gratuities, pensions, allowances or emoluments to, any persons who are or were at any time in the employment or service of the Company, or of any company which is a subsidiary of the Company, or is allied or associated with the Company or with any such subsidiary company, or who are or were at any time directors or officers of the Company or of any such other company as aforesaid, and holding or who have held any salaried employment or office in the Company or such other company, and the spouses, widows, widowers, families and dependants of any such persons. The Directors Board may also establish and subsidise or subscribe to any institutions, associations, clubs or funds calculated to be for the benefit of or to advance the interests and well-being of the Company or of any such other company as aforesaid or of any such persons as aforesaid, and may make payments for or towards the insurance of any such persons as aforesaid, and subscribe or guarantee money for charitable or benevolent objects or for any exhibition or for any public, general or useful object. The Directors Board may do any of the matters aforesaid, either alone or in conjunction with any such other company as aforesaid. Any Director holding any such employment or office shall be entitled to participate in and retain for his own benefit any such donation, gratuity, pension, allowance or emolument.

AUTHENTICATION OF DOCUMENTS

148.152. (Aa) Any Director or the Secretary or other authorised officer of the Company shall have power to authenticate any documents affecting the constitution of the Company and any resolutions passed by the Company or the DirectorsBoard or any committee, and any books, records, documents and accounts relating to the business of the Company, and to certify copies thereof or extracts therefrom as true copies of extracts; and where any books, records, documents or accounts are elsewhere than at the Registered Office or the Head Office, the local manager or such other officer of the Company having the custody thereof shall be deemed to be the authorised officer of the Company as aforesaid.

(b) (B) A document purporting to be a document so authenticated or a copy of a resolution, or an extract from the minutes of a meeting, of the Company or of the DirectorsBoard or any local board or committee, or of any books, records, documents or accounts or extracts therefrom as aforesaid, and which is certified as aforesaid, shall be conclusive evidence in favour of all persons dealing with the Company upon the faith thereof that the document authenticated (or, if this be authenticated as aforesaid, the matter so authenticated) is authentic or, as the case may be, that such resolution has been duly passed or, as the case may be, that any minute so extracted is a true and accurate record of proceedings at a duly constituted meeting or, as the case may be, that the copies of such books, records, documents or accounts were true copies of their originals or, as the case may be, the extracts of such books, records, documents or accounts have been properly extracted and are true and accurate records of the books, records, documents or accounts from which they were extracted.

CAPITALISATION OF RESERVES

(Aa) The Company in general meeting may, upon the recommendation of the Directors Board, resolve to capitalise any sum standing to the credit of any of the Company's reserves reserve accounts which are available for distribution (including anyits share premium account or undistributable reserve,) or any undivided profits not required for the payment or provision of the dividend on any shares with a preferential right to dividend, by appropriating and capital redemption reserve fund, subject to the Companies Act) and to appropriate such sum or profitssums to the holders of sShares on the #Register at the close of business on the date of the relevant resolution (or such other date as may hebe specified therein or determined as provided therein) in the proportions in which such sum would have been divisible amongst them had the same been a distribution of profits by way of dividend on shares either in or towards paying up any amounts for the time being unpaid on any shares held by such shareholders respectively orand to apply such sum on their behalf in paying up in full unissued shares or debentures or other securities of the Company to be allotted Shares for allotment and distributed ion credited as fully paid up to and amongst such shareholdersthem in the proportion aforesaid, or partly in one way and partly in the other

- (b)(B) WheneverSubject to the Companies Act, whenever such a resolution as aforesaidunder this Article shall have been passed, the Directors Board shall make all appropriations and applications of the reserves or profits and undivided profits resolved to be capitalised thereby, and attend to all allotments and issues of fully paid sShares, debentures, or other securities and generally shall do all acts and things required to give effect thereto. For the purpose of giving effect to any resolution under this Article, the Directors Board may settle any difficulty which may arise in regard to a capitalisation issue as they it thinks fit, and in particular may disregard fractional entitlements or round the same up or down and may determine that cash payments shall be made to any sShareholders in lieu of fractional entitlements or that fractions of such value as the Directors Board may determine may be disregarded in order to adjust the rights of all parties or that fractional entitlements shall be aggregated and sold and the benefit shall accrue to the Company rather than to the sShareholders concerned, and no sShareholders who are affected thereby shall be deemed to be, and they shall be deemed not to be, a separate class of schareholders for any purposes whatsoever. Without limiting the generality of the foregoing, any such agreement may provide for the acceptance by such persons of the <u>sS</u>hares, debentures or other securities to be allotted and distributed to them respectively in satisfaction of their claims in respect of the sum so capitalised.
- (c) (C) The provisions of paragraph (Ee) of Article 1560 shall apply to the power of the Company to capitalise under this Article as it applies to the grant of election thereunder mutatis mutandis and no sShareholder who may be affected thereby shall be, and they shall be deemed not to be, a separate class of sShareholders for any purposes whatsoever.

DIVIDENDS AND RESERVES

- 150.154. The Subject to the Companies Act and these Articles, the Company in general meeting may declare dividends in any currency but no dividends shall exceed the amount recommended by the Directors Board.

(Aa) The Directors Board may subject to Article 1562 from time to time pay to the schareholders such interim dividends as appear to the Directors Board to be justified by the financial conditions and the net realisable value of the assets profits of the Company and, in particular (but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing), if at any time the share capital of the Company is divided into different classes, the Directors Board may pay such interim dividends in respect of those schares in the capital of the Company which confer to the holders thereof deferred or non-preferential rights as well as in respect of those schares which confer on the holders thereof preferential rights with regard to dividend and provided that the Directors Board acts bona fide they it shall not incur any responsibility to the holders of schares conferring any preference for any damage that they may suffer by reason of the payment of an interim dividend on any schares having deferred or non-preferential rights.

- (b) (B) The Directors Board may also pay half-yearly or at other suitable intervals to be settled by themit any dividend which may be payable at a fixed rate if the Directors are Board is of the opinion that the financial conditions and the net realisable value of the assets profits of the Company justify the payment.
- (c) (C) The Directors Board may in addition from time to time declare and pay special dividends of such amounts and on such dates and out of such distributable funds of the Company and (including share premium) as they it thinks fit, and the provisions of paragraph (Aa) of this Article as regards the power and exemption from liability of the Directors Board as relate to the declaration and payment of interim dividends shall apply, mutatis mutandis, to the declaration and payment of any such special dividends.

- (e)(E) The Directors Board may on any occasion determine that rights of election and the allotment of sShares under paragraph (Aa) of this Article shall not be made available or made to any sShareholders with registered addresses in any territory where in the absence of a registration statement or other special formalities the circulation of an offer of such rights of election or the allotment of sShares would or might be unlawful or impracticable or the legality or practicability of which may be time consuming or expensive to ascertain whether in absolute terms or in relation to the value of the holding of sShares of the sShareholder concerned, and in such event the provisions aforesaid shall be read and construed subject to such determination and no sShareholder who may be affected by any such determination shall be, and they shall be deemed not to be, a separate class of sShareholders for any purposes whatsoever.

- 157.161. The DirectorsBoard may, before recommending any dividend, set aside out of the profits of the Company such sums as they it thinks fit as a reserve or reserves which shall, at the discretion of the DirectorsBoard, be applicable for meeting claims on or liabilities of the Company or contingencies or for paying off any loan capital or for equalising dividends or for any other purpose to which the profits of the Company may be properly applied, and pending such application may, at the like discretion, either be employed in the business of the Company or be invested in such investments (including in the repurchase by the Company of its own securities or the giving of any financial assistance for the acquisition of its own securities) as the DirectorsBoard may from time to time think fit, and so that it shall not be necessary to keep any investments constituting the reserve or reserves separate or distinct from any other investments of the Company. The DirectorsBoard may also without placing the same to reserve, carry forward any profits which theyit may think prudent not to distribute by way of dividend.
- 158.162. Unless and to the extent that the rights attached to any sShares or the terms of issue thereof otherwise provide, all dividends shall (as regards any sShares not fully paid throughout the period in respect of which the dividend is paid) be apportioned and paid pro rata according to the amounts paid or credited as paid on the sShares during any portion or portions of the period in respect of which the dividend is paid. For the purposes of this Article no amount paid on a sShare in advance of calls pursuant to Article 38 shall be treated as paid on the sShare.
- 159.163. (Aa) The Directors Board may retain any dividends or other moneys payable on or in respect of a sShare upon which the Company has a lien, and may apply the same in or towards satisfaction of the debts, liabilities or engagements in respect of which the lien exists.(A)
 - (b)(B) The <u>DirectorsBoard</u> may deduct from any dividend or other money payable to any <u>sS</u>hareholder all sums of money (if any) presently payable by him to the Company on account of calls, instalments or otherwise.
- 160.164. Any general meeting sanctioning a dividend may make a call on the sShareholders of such amount as the meeting fixes, but so that the call on each sShareholder shall not exceed the dividend payable to him, and so that the call shall be made payable at the same time as the dividend, and the dividend may, if so arranged between the Company and the sShareholder, be set off against the call.
- <u>161. 165.</u> A transfer of <u>sS</u>hares shall not, as against the Company but without prejudice to the rights of the transferor and transferee inter se, pass the rights to any dividend or bonus declared thereon before the registration of the transfer.

- <u>162.166.</u> If two or more persons are registered as joint holders of any <u>sS</u>hare, any one of such persons may give effectual receipts for any dividends and other moneys payable and bonuses, rights and other distributions in respect of such <u>sS</u>hares.
- 163.167. Unless otherwise directed by the Directors Board, any dividend or other moneys payable or bonuses, rights or other distributions in respect of any sShare may be paid or satisfied by cheque or warrant or certifica#te or other documents or evidence of title sent through the post to the registered address of the sShareholder entitled, or, in the case of joint holders, to the registered address of that one whose name stands first in the <u>rRegister</u> in respect of the joint holding or to such person and to such address as the holder or joint holders may in writing direct. Every cheque, warrant, certificate or other document or evidence of title so sent shall be made payable to the order of the person to whom it is sent or, in the case of certificates or other documents or evidence of title as aforesaid, in favour of the <u>sS</u>hareholder(s) entitled thereto, and the payment on any such cheque or warrant by the banker upon whom it is drawn shall operate as a good discharge to the Company in respect of the dividend and/or other moneys represented thereby, notwithstanding that it may subsequently appear that the same has been stolen or that any endorsement thereon has been forged. Every such cheque, warrant, certificate or other document or evidence of title as aforesaid shall be sent at the risk of the person entitled to the dividend, money, bonus, rights and other distributions represented thereby.
- 164.168. All dividends, bonuses or other distributions or the proceeds of the realisation of any of the foregoing unclaimed for one year after having been declared may be invested or otherwise made use of by the DirectorsBoard for the benefit of the Company until claimed and, notwithstanding any entry in any books of the Company or otherwise howsoever, the Company shall not be constituted a trustee in respect thereof. All dividends, bonuses or other distributions or the proceeds of the realisation of any of the foregoing unclaimed for six6 years after having been declared may be forfeited by the DirectorsBoard and, upon such forfeiture, shall revert to the Company and, in the case where any of the same are securities of the Company, may be re-allotted or re-issued for such consideration as the Directors Board thinks fit and the proceeds thereof shall accrue to the benefit of the Company absolutely.

RECORD DATE

165.169. Any resolution declaring a dividend or other distribution on sShares of any class, whether a resolution of the Company in general meeting or a resolution of the DirectorsBoard, may specify that the same shall be payable or made to the persons registered as the holder of such sShares at the close of business on a particular date or at a particular time on a particular date, notwithstanding that it may be a date prior to that on which the resolution is passed, and thereupon the dividend or other distribution shall be payable or made to them in accordance with their respective holdings so registered, but without prejudice to the rights inter se in respect of such dividend or other distribution between the transferors and transferees of any such sShares. The provisions of this Article shall mutatis mutandis apply to determining the Shareholders entitled to receive notice and vote at any general meeting of the Company, bonuses, capitalisation issues, distributions of realised and unrealised capital profits or other distributable reserves or accounts of the Company and offers or grants made by the Company to the sShareholders.

DISTRIBUTION OF REALISED CAPITAL PROFITS

166.170. The Company in general meeting may at any time and from time to time resolve that any surplus moneys in the hands of the Company representing capital profits arising from moneys received or recovered in respect of or arising from the realisation of any capital assets of the Company or any investments representing the same and not required for the payment or provision of any fixed preferential dividend instead of being applied in the purchase of any other capital assets or for other capital purposes be distributed amongst its sShareholders on the footing that they receive the same as capital and in the sShares and proportions in which they would have been entitled to receive the same if it had been distributed by way of dividend, provided that no such surplus moneys as aforesaid shall be so distributed unless the Company will remain solvent after the distribution, or the net realisable value of the assets of the Company will after the distribution be greater than the aggregate of its liabilities, share capital and share premium account.

ANNUAL RETURNS

<u>167.171.</u> The <u>DirectorsBoard</u> shall make or cause to be made such annual or other returns or filings as may be required to be made in accordance with the <u>StatutesCompanies</u> Act.

ACCOUNTS

- 168.172. The Directors Board shall cause true accounts proper books of account to be kept of the sums of money received and expended by the Company, and the matters in respect of which such receipts and expenditure take place; and of the property, assets, credits and liabilities of the Company and of all other matters required by the Statutes or Companies Act necessary to give a true and fair view of the state of the Company's affairs and to show and explain its transactions.
- <u>169. 173.</u> The books of account shall be kept at the Head Office or at such other place or places as the <u>Directors Board</u> thinks fit and shall always be open to the inspection of the Directors.
- 170.174. No sShareholder (not being a Director) or other person shall have any right of inspecting any account or book or document of the Company except as conferred by the StatutesCompanies Act or ordered by a court of competent jurisdiction or authorised by the DirectorsBoard or the Company in general meeting.
- 171.175. (Aa) The Directors Board shall from time to time cause to be prepared and laid before the Company at its annual general meeting profit and loss accounts, and balance sheets, group accounts (if any) of the Company and such other reports and, so long documents as any shares in the Company are with the consent of the Company listed on The Stock Exchange of Hong Kong Limited, themay be required by law and the Listing Rules. The accounts of the Company shall be prepared and audited based on the generally accepted accounting principles of Hong Kong, the International Accounting Standards, or such other standards as may be permitted by the stock exchange in the Relevant Territory on which any of the shares in the Company are with the consent of the Company listed on such exchange, and the accounting principles or standards adopted shall be disclosed in the financial statements and the report of the AuditorsHK Stock Exchange.(A)

- (b)(B) Every Subject to paragraph (c) below, every balance sheet of the Company shall be signed on behalf of the Directors Board by two2 of the Directors and a copy of every balance sheet (including every document required by law to be comprised therein or annexed thereto) and profit and loss account which is to be laid before the Company at its annual general meeting, together with a copy of the Directors' report and a copy of the Auditors' report thereon, shall, not less than twenty one 21 days before the date of the meeting be delivered or sent to every shareholder of, Shareholder and every holder of debentures of. Debenture Holder of the Company and every other person entitled to receive notices of general meetings of the Company under the provisions of these Articles with the notice of the annual general meeting, provided that this Article shall not affect the operation of paragraph (c) of this Article, or require a copy of those documents to be sent to any person of whose address the Company is not aware or to more than one of the joint holders of any sShares or dDebentures, but any shareholder or holder of debenturesShareholder or Debenture Holder to whom a copy of those documents has not been sent shall be entitled to receive a copy free of charge on application at the Head Office or the Registration Office. If all or any of the sShares or dDebentures or other securities of the Company shall for the time being be (with the consent of the Company) listed or dealt in on any stock exchange or market, there shall be forwarded to such stock exchange or market such number of copies of such documents as may for the time being be required under its regulations or practice.
- (c) Subject to due compliance with the Companies Act and the rules of the stock exchange in the Relevant Territory, and to obtaining all necessary consents, if any, required thereunder and such consents being in full force and effect, the requirements of Article 171(b) shall be deemed satisfied in relation to any person by sending to the person in any manner not prohibited by the Companies Act and instead of such copies, a summary financial statement derived from the Company's annual financial statements and the directors' report thereon, which shall be in the form and containing the information required by applicable laws and regulation, provided that any person who is otherwise entitled to the annual financial statements of the Company and the directors' report thereon may, if he so requires by notice in writing served on the Company, demands that the Company sends to him, in addition to a summary financial statement, a complete printed copy of the Company's annual financial statements and the directors' report thereon.

AUDITORS

172.476. (Aa) The Company shall at each annual general meeting by Ordinary Resolutions appoint one or more firms of auditors to hold office until the conclusion of the next annual general meeting on such terms and with such duties as may be agreed with the DirectorsBoard, but if an appointment is not made, the Auditors in office shall continue in office until a successor is appointed. A Director, officer or employee of the Company or of any of its subsidiaries or a

- partner, officer or employee of any such Director, officer or employee shall not be appointed Auditors of the Company.
- (b) The Directors Board may fill any casual vacancy in the office of Auditors, but while any such vacancy continues the surviving or continuing Auditor or Auditors (if any) may act. Subject to Article 172(d), an Auditor appointed under this paragraph (b) shall hold office until the first annual general meeting of the Company after his appointment and shall then be subject to appointment by the Shareholders under this Article at such remuneration to be determined by the Shareholders under this Article.
- (c) The remuneration of the Auditors shall be fixed by or on the authority of the Company in the annual general meeting except that in any particular year the Company in Ordinary Resolution passed at a general meeting may delegate the fixing of or in such remuneration to manner as the Directors Shareholders may by Ordinary Resolution determine, and the remuneration of any Auditors appointed to fill any casual vacancy may be fixed by the Directors Board.
- (d)(B) The <u>sS</u>hareholders may, at any general meeting convened and held in accordance with these Articles, remove the <u>Auditor or Auditors</u> by <u>SpecialOrdinary</u> Resolution at any time before the expiration of the term of office and shall, by Ordinary Resolution, at that meeting appoint <u>another new Aa</u>uditors in its place for the remainder of the term.
- 173.177. The Auditors of the Company shall have a right of access at all times to the books and accounts and vouchers of the Company and shall be entitled to require from the Directors and officers of the Company such information as may be necessary for the performance of his or their duties, and the Auditors shall make a report to the shareholders on the accounts examined by them and onaudit every balance sheet, consolidated balance sheet and consolidated profit and loss account intended toof the Company in each year and prepare an Auditors' report thereon to be annexed thereto. Such report shall be laid before the Company in the annual general meeting during their tenure of office.

- <u>174.178.</u> No person other than the retiring Auditors shall be appointed as Auditors at an annual general meeting unless notice of an intention to nominate that person to the office of Auditors has been given to the Company not less than <u>fourteen14</u> clear days before the annual general meeting, and the Company shall send a copy of any such notice to the retiring Auditors and shall give notice thereof to the <u>sS</u>hareholders not less than <u>seven7</u> days before the annual general meeting provided that the above requirement for sending a copy of such notice to the retiring Auditors may be waived by notice in writing by the retiring Auditors to the Secretary.
- 175. 179. All acts done by any person acting as Auditors shall, as regards all persons dealing in good faith with the Company, be valid, notwithstanding that there was some defect in their appointment or that they were at the time of their appointment not qualified for appointment or subsequently became disqualified.

NOTICES

- 176.189. (a) (i) Any notice or document (including any "corporate communication" within the meaning ascribed thereto under the Listing Rules), whether or not to be given or issued under these Articles by the Company, shall be in writing, and or by cable, telex or facsimile transmission message or other form of electronic transmission or electronic communication and any such notice and document may be served given or issued by the Company on any shareholder either following means:-
 - (A) by serving it personally or on the relevant person;
 - (B) by sending it through the post in a prepaid envelope or wrapper addressed to such <u>sS</u>hareholder at his registered address as appearing in the <u>rR</u>egister or at any other address supplied by him to the Company for the purpose;
 - (C) by delivering or leaving it at such registered address as aforesaid or (in the case of a notice) by advertisement in the Newspapers or displaying the relevant notice conspicuously at the Registered Office and the Head Office.;
 - (D) by placing an advertisement in appropriate Newspapers or other publication and where applicable, in accordance with the requirements of the stock exchange in the Relevant Territory;
 - (E) by sending or transmitting it as an electronic communication to the relevant person at such electronic address as he may provide under Article 176(a)(iv), subject to the Company complying with the Companies Act and any other applicable laws, rules and regulations from time to time in force with regard to any requirements for the obtaining of consent (or deemed consent) from such person;

- 180.184. Any person who, by operation of law, transfer, transmission or other means whatsoever, shall become entitled to any shareShare, shall be bound by every notice in respect of such shareShare, which prior to his name and address (including electronic address) being entered onin the register Register as the registered holder of such Share, shall have been duly served or deemed to have been duly served to the person from whom he derives his title to such sShare.

Any notice or document delivered or sent by post or by electronic means to, or left at the registered address of any sShareholder in pursuance of these presentsArticles, shall notwithstanding that such sShareholder be then deceased, bankrupt or wound up and whether or not the Company has notice of his death, bankruptcy or winding up, be deemed to have been duly served in respect of any registered sShares whether held solely or jointly with other persons by such sShareholder until some other person be registered in his stead as the holder or joint holder thereof, and such service shall for all purposes of these presentsArticles be deemed a sufficient service of such notice or document on his personal representatives and all persons (if any) jointly interested with him in any such sShares.
- 182.186. The signature to any notice or document to be given by the Company may be written or, printed or in electronic form.

INFORMATION

183. 187. No sShareholder (not being a Director) shall be entitled to require discovery of or any information respecting any detail of the Company's trading or any matter which is or may be in the nature of a trade secret, mystery of trade or secret process which may relate to the conduct of the business of the Company which in the opinion of the Directors itBoard will be inexpedient in the interests of the sShareholders of the Company to communicate to the public.

AWINDING UP

- 184.188. Subject to the Companies Act, a resolution that the Company be wound up by the Court or be wound up voluntarily shall be passed by way of a Special Resolution.
- 185.189. If the Company shall be wound up, the surplus assets remaining after payment to all creditors shall be divided among the sShareholders in proportion to the capital paid up on the sShares held by them respectively, and if such surplus assets shall be insufficient to repay the whole of the paid up capital, they shall be distributed, subject to the rights of any sShares which may be issued on special terms and conditions, so that, as nearly as may be, the losses shall be borne by the sShareholders in proportion to the capital paid on the sShares held by them respectively.

186. 199. The Directors, Managing Directors, alternate Directors, Auditors, Secretary and other officers for the time being of the Company and the trustees (if any) for the time being acting in relation to any of the affairs of the Company, and their respective executors or administrators, shall be indemnified and secured harmless out of the assets of the Company from and against all actions, costs, charges, losses, damages and expenses which they or any of them, their or any of their executors or administrators, shall or may incur or sustain by reason of any act done, concurred in or omitted in or about the execution of their duty or supposed duty in their respective offices or trusts, except such (if any) as they shall incur or sustain through their own fraud or dishonesty, and none of them shall be answerable for the acts, receipts, neglects or defaults of any other of them, or for joining in any receipt for the sake of conformity, or for any bankers or other persons with whom any moneys or effects of the Company shall be lodged or deposited for safe custody, or for the insufficiency or deficiency of any security upon which any moneys of the Company shall be placed out or invested, or for any other loss, misfortune or damage which may arise in the execution of their respective offices or trusts, or in relation thereto, except as the same shall happen by or through their own fraud-or, dishonesty, or recklessness. The Company may take out and pay the premium and other moneys for the maintenance of insurance, bonds and other instruments for the benefit either of the Company or the Directors (and/or other officers) or any of them to indemnify the Company and/or-the Directors (and/or other officers) named therein for this purpose against any loss, damage, liability and claim which they may suffer or sustain in connection with any breach by the Directors (and/or other officers) or any of them of their duties to the Company.

UNTRACEABLE SHAREHOLDERS

- 188.192. However, the The Company may exercise the power to cease sending cheques for dividend entitlements or dividend warrants if such cheques or warrants remain uncashed on 2 consecutive occasions or after the first occasion on which such a cheque or warrant is returned undelivered or where such cheque or warrant has been left uncashed on two consecutive occasions. The provisions of this Article shall apply to certificates of and other documents or evidence of title to, and proceeds of realisation of, distributions on sShares other than money.
- 189.193. (Aa) The Company shall have the power to sell, in such manner as the Directors

 Board thinks fit, any sShares of a sShareholder who is untraceable, but no such sale shall be made unless:
 - (i) during the period of twelve12 years prior to the date of publication of the advertisements referred to in sub-paragraph (bild) below (or, if published more than once, the first thereof) at least three3 dividends or other distributions in respect of the self have become payable or been made and no dividend or other distribution in respect of the shares during that period has been claimed;
 - (ii) the Company has caused an advertisement to be inserted in the Newspapers of its intention to sell such <u>sS</u>hares and a period of <u>three-3</u> <u>mM</u>onths has elapsed since the date of such advertisement (or, if published more than once, the first thereof);
 - (iii) the Company has not at any time during the said periods of twelve12 years and three-3 mMonths received any indication of the existence of the shareholder who is the-holder of such sShares or of a person entitled to such sShares by death, bankruptcy or operation of law; and
 - (iv) the Company has notified the stock exchange in the Relevant TerritoryHK Stock Exchange of its intention of such sale.
 - (b)(B) To give effect to any such sale the <u>DirectorsBoard</u> may authorise any person to transfer the said <u>sS</u>hares and the instrument of transfer signed or otherwise executed by or on behalf of such person shall be as effective as if it had been executed by the registered holder or the person entitled by transmission to such <u>sS</u>hares, and the purchaser shall not be bound to see to the application of the purchase money nor shall his title to the <u>sS</u>hares be affected by any irregularity or invalidity in the proceedings relating to the sale. The net proceeds of the sale will belong to the Company and upon receipt

by the Company of such proceeds it shall become indebted to the former sShareholder for an amount equal to such net proceeds. Notwithstanding any entries made by the Company in any of its books or otherwise howsoever, no trusts shall be created in respect of such debt and no interest shall be payable in respect of it and the Company shall not be required to account for any money earned from the net proceeds which may be employed in the business of the Company or as it thinks fit. Any sale under this Article shall be valid and effective notwithstanding that the <u>sS</u>hareholder holding the <u>sS</u>hares sold is dead, bankrupt, wound up or otherwise under any legal disability or incapacity.

DESTRUCTION OF DOCUMENTS

190. 194. (A) The Company may destroy:

- (a) any share certificate which has been cancelled at any time after the expiry of one year from the date of such cancellation;
- (b) any dividend mandate or any variation or cancellation thereof or any notification of change of name or address at any time after the expiry of two2 years from the date on which such mandate, variation, cancellation or notification was recorded by the Company;
- (c) any instrument of transfer of <u>sS</u>hares which has been registered at any time after the expiry of six6 years from the date of registration; and
- (d) any other document, on the basis of which any entry in the register of members of the CompanyRegister is made, at any time after the expiry of six6 years from the date on which an entry in the #Register was first made in respect of it;
 - and it shall conclusively be presumed in favour of the Company that every share certificate so destroyed was a valid certificate duly and properly cancelled and that every instrument of transfer so destroyed was a valid and effective instrument duly and properly registered and that every other document destroyed hereunder was a valid and effective document in accordance with the recorded particulars thereof in the books or records of the Company. Provided provided always that:
 - (i) the foregoing provisions of this Article shall apply only to the destruction of a document in good faith and without express notice to the Company that the preservation of such document was relevant to a claim;

- (ii) nothing contained in this Article shall be construed as imposing upon the Company any liability in respect of the destruction of any such document earlier than as aforesaid or in any case where the conditions of proviso (i) above are not fulfilled; and
- (iii) references in this Article to the destruction of any document include reference to its disposal in any manner.
- (B) Notwithstanding any provision contained in these Articles, the Directors may, if permitted by applicable law, authorise the destruction of documents set out in sub-paragraphs (a) to (d) of paragraph (A) of this Article and any other documents in relation to share registration which have been microfilmed or electronically stored by the Company or by the share registrar on its behalf provided always that this Article shall apply only to the destruction of a document in good faith and without express notice to the Company and its share registrar that the preservation of such document was relevant to a claim.

SUBSCRIPTION RIGHT RESERVE

- 191. 195. The following provisions shall have effect to the extent that they are not prohibited by and are in compliance with the Statutes Companies Act:
 - (a) (A) If, so long as any of the rights attaching to any warrants issued by the Company to subscribe for shares of the CompanyShares shall remain exercisable, the Company does any act or engages in any transaction which, as a result of any adjustments to the subscription price in accordance with the provisions applicable under the terms and conditions of the warrants, would reduce the subscription price to below the par value of a sShare, then the following provisions shall apply:
 - (i) as from the date of such act or transaction the Company shall establish and thereafter (subject as provided in this Article) maintain in accordance with the provisions of this Article a reserve (the "Subscription Right Reserve") the amount of which shall at no time be less than the sum which for the time being would be required to be capitalised and applied in paying up in full the nominal amount of the additional <u>sShares</u> required to be issued and allotted credited as fully paid pursuant to sub-paragraph (iii) below on the exercise in full of all the subscription rights outstanding and shall apply the Subscription Right Reserve in paying up in full the amount of the shortfall referred to in sub-paragraph (iii) in respect of such additional <u>sShares</u> as and when the same are allotted;

- (ii) the Subscription Right Reserve shall not be used for any purpose other than that specified above unless all other reserves of the Company (other than the share premium account) have been extinguished and will then only be used to make good losses of the Company if and so far as is required by law;
- (iii) upon the exercise of all or any of the subscription rights represented by any warrant, the relevant subscription rights shall be exercisable in respect of a nominal amount of <u>sS</u>hares equal to the amount in cash which the holder of such warrant is required to pay on exercise of the subscription rights represented thereby (or, as the case may be, the relevant portion thereof in the event of a partial exercise of the subscription rights) and, in addition, there shall be allotted in respect of such subscription rights to the exercising <u>warrantholderwarrant holder</u>, credited as fully paid, such additional nominal amount of <u>sS</u>hares as is equal to the shortfall between:
 - (A)(aa) the said amount in cash which the holder of such warrant is required to pay on exercise of the subscription rights represented thereby (or, as the case may be, the relevant portion thereof in the event of a partial exercise of the subscription rights); and
 - the nominal amount of sShares in respect of which such subscription rights would have been exercisable having regard to the provisions of the conditions of the warrants, had it been possible for such subscription rights to represent the right to subscribe for sShares at less than par, and immediately upon such exercise so much of the sum standing to the credit of the Subscription Right Reserve as is required to pay up in full such additional nominal amount of sShares shall be capitalised and applied in paying up in full such additional nominal amount of sShares which shall forthwith be allotted credited as fully paid to the exercising warrantholderwarrant holder; and

- if upon the exercise of the subscription rights represented by any warrant the amount standing to the credit of the Subscription Right Reserve is not sufficient to pay up in full such additional nominal amount of sShares equal to such shortfall as aforesaid to which the exercising warrantholderwarrant holder is entitled, the DirectorsBoard shall apply any profits or reserves then or thereafter becoming available (including, to the extent permitted or not prohibited by law, the share premium account) for such purpose until such additional nominal amount of sShares is paid up and allotted as aforesaid and until then no dividend or other distribution shall be paid or made on the fully paid shares of the CompanyShares then in issue. Pending such payment up and allotment, the exercising warrantholderwarrant holder shall be issued by the Company with a certificate evidencing his right to the allotment of such additional nominal amount of sShares. The rights represented by any such certificate shall be in registered form and shall be transferable in whole or in part in units of one sShare in the like manner as the sShares for the time being are transferable, and the Company shall make such arrangements in relation to the maintenance of a register therefor and other matters in relation thereto as the Directors Board may think fit and adequate particulars thereof shall be made known to each relevant exercising warrantholderwarrant holder upon the issue of such certificate.
- (b) (B) Shares allotted pursuant to the provisions of this Article shall rank pari passu in all respects with the other <u>sS</u>hares allotted or which ought to be allotted on the relevant exercise of the subscription rights represented by the warrant concerned. Notwithstanding anything contained in paragraph (Aa) of this Article, no fraction of any <u>sS</u>hare shall be allotted on exercise of the subscription rights.
- (c) (C) The provisions of this Article as to the establishment and maintenance of the Subscription Right Reserve shall not be altered or added to in any way which would vary or abrogate, or which would have the effect of varying or abrogating, the provisions for the benefit of any warrantholderwarrant holder or class of warrantholderswarrant holders under this Article without the sanction of a Special Resolution of such warrant holder(s) or class of warrant holders.

(d) (D) A certificate or report by the Auditors as to whether or not the Subscription Right Reserve is required to be established and maintained and if so the amount thereof so required to be established and maintained, as to the purposes for which the Subscription Right Reserve has been used, as to the extent to which it has been used to make good losses of the Company, as to the additional nominal amount of schares required to be allotted to exercising warrantholderswarrant holders credited as fully paid, and as to any other matter concerning the Subscription Right Reserve shall (in the absence of manifest error) be conclusive and binding upon the Company and all warrantholderswarrant holders and schareholders.

STOCK

- 192.196. The following provisions shall have effect at any time and from time to time provided that they are not prohibited by or inconsistent with the Statutes Companies Act:
 - (a)(i) The Company may by Ordinary Resolution convert any fully paid <u>sS</u>hares into stock, and may from time to time by like resolution reconvert any stock into fully paid <u>sS</u>hares of any denomination.
 - (b)(ii) The holders of stock may transfer the same or any part thereof in the same manner, and subject to the same regulations as and subject to which the sShares from which the stock arose might prior to conversion have been transferred or as near thereto as circumstances admit, but the DirectorsBoard may from time to time, if they it thinks fit, fix the minimum amount of stock transferable and restrict or prohibit the transfer of fractions of that minimum, but so that such minimum shall not exceed the nominal amount of the sShares from which the stock arose. No warrants to bearer shall be issued in respect of any stock.
 - (c) (iii) The holders of stock shall, according to the amount of the stock held by them, have the same rights, privileges and advantages as regards dividends, participation in assets on a winding up, voting at meetings, and other matters, as if they held the schares from which the stock arose, but no such rights, privileges or advantages (except participation in the dividends and profits and in the assets on winding up of the Company) shall be conferred by an amount of stock which would not, if existing in schares, have conferred such rights, privileges or advantages.
 - (d) (iv) Such of the provisions of these Articles as are applicable to fully paid <u>sS</u>hares shall apply to stock, and the words <u>""</u><u>sShare"</u> and <u>""</u><u>sShareholder"</u> herein shall include <u>""</u><u>stock"</u> and <u>""</u><u>stockholder"</u> and "member".

FINANCIAL YEAR

193. <u>Unless otherwise determined by the Board, the financial year</u> of the Company shall end on the 31st day of December in each year.
